The Information Systems and Technology Department (IST) serves the data, networking and voice needs of City staff and associated agencies. Its mission is to provide a secure efficient and well-coordinated computing and voice environment through local and wide area network systems; desktop computer systems; cost effective software selection and licensing; and the use of shared peripheral devices on the network.

Departmental Goals

- Enable current and proposed data, voice and video systems to be shared between City departments
- Work closely with partner agencies to share electronic data, which empower staff to effectively manipulate information for the purposes of providing useful, timely and accurate information to the public
- Develop Disaster Recovery plan for the City's data, network and voice systems
- Preserve and enhance our investment in the City's geographical information system (GIS)
- Help City staff utilize information technology more effectively
