

MIKE'S FRIDAY MEMO

July 17, 2009

1. Be sure to mark your calendars for the 2009 Milwaukie Daze Festival on July 24 and 25 featuring free events for all members of the family. The festivities start Friday night at 9 p.m. on the grounds of the Portland Waldorf School, 2300 SE Harrison, where families can enjoy a piece of cake to celebrate Oregon's 150th Birthday while watching *Goonies*. This is an Oregon 150 event, and our special guest Seski the Sasquatch will help serve cake. So if you see something very tall with brownish-gray fur moving about the Portland Waldorf School grounds that night, please do not call in a Sasquatch sighting. Like our state, Seski is celebrating his 150th birthday, yet he's very modern with a website <http://www.oregon150.org/2008/06/06/seski-sasquatch/> that tells his story and tracks his appearances.

Saturday the fun begins with a downtown parade on Main Street at 10:30 a.m. followed by field games, petting zoo, climbing wall, and huge inflatable toys at the Portland Waldorf School from noon to 2 p.m. From 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. there is a Poetry Picnic hosted by Tom Hogan with an open mic, music by Eric Stern of the Vagabond Opera, art show, and book sale. The Friends of the Ledding Library and Papa Murphy's will have drinks and snacks for sale. At 4 p.m. the beer garden opens and live music begins at Riverfront Park. Return Flight kicks off the entertainment at 4 p.m., Captain Bogg and Salty at 6:30 p.m., and The Touchables at 8:00 p.m. Warm up your pitching arms because here's your chance to "Dunk the Mayor." SunsUp Tanning Salon is bringing a dunk tank to Riverfront Park, and Jeremy has volunteered for the 3 p.m. – 4 p.m. shift. Test your culinary skills and enter the Bob's Red Mill Bing Cherry Cooking Contest. The categories are savory, dessert, and best overall. Entries must be at the judges' stand near the music stage by 5:30 p.m. with awards at 6 p.m. The grand finale fireworks show begins on the River at 10 p.m.

9. The Ledding Library staff is asking its patrons an unusual favor. If you have books due between July 26 and August 3, please keep them for another week. The whole county library network is migrating to a new computer system, and no materials can be checked back in during that period. Not to worry – all due dates have been adjusted, and late fines will not be charged.

11. The Milwaukie Farmers' Market 11th season is in full swing with lots of fresh produce for sale, artisan cheeses and breads, plants, cut flowers, crafts, and much more. The Market is noted for its family-friendly atmosphere, so join

your friends and neighbors from 9:30 a.m. to 2 p.m. in the City Hall parking lot in downtown Milwaukie and support local farmers, growers, and artisans. 12. At its July 13 meeting the Planning Commission approved the North Clackamas School District application for a variance to the City's shared parking standards. Milwaukie High School is required to provide approximately 341 parking spaces, most of which have been located on lots shared with other nearby properties. The school requested a variance to allow it to count the existing parking spaces located at the school's Lake Road playing fields toward meeting the parking requirements.
13. At its July 21 work session Council will hear a report on a public request for a code amendment related to notices, advertisements, and door hangers. In the regular session Mayor Ferguson will read a proclamation naming July as National Ice Cream Month (as originally proclaimed by President Ronald Regan in 1984). The consent agenda includes resolutions reappointing Susanna Pai to the Public Safety Advisory Committee, blanket purchase orders for fiscal year 2009 – 2010, and changes to Council meeting times on August 4, National Night Out.
14. You can now watch City Council meetings on-demand if you have an internet connection. Meetings are streamed live from the City's website, and archived meetings are available for viewing as well. The archived videos and action minutes are available the morning after the meeting. To access the live streaming video or watch an archived meeting, visit the City's website at www.cityofmilwaukie.org, click on Council Agendas in the Quick Links section in the upper left-hand corner of the homepage, choose the meeting you want to watch, and use the "jump-to" drop down to watch a specific portion of the agenda.

The Council meetings continue to be broadcast live on Channel 30 and are replayed at various times throughout the week, so check *The Pilot* for the schedule.
