

ORDINANCE NO. 1482

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 1451 ESTABLISHING A SENIOR CITIZENS ADVISORY COMMISSION.

THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:


Section 2 of Ordinance No. 1451 is amended to read:

Section 2. The Advisory Commission shall consist of nine members, appointed by the Mayor with the consent of the City Council, at least seven of whom shall be residents of the city. Five members must be over 60 years old. No more than three members of the Commission shall be employees of organizations or agencies which provide senior citizens service programs, and all members shall serve without compensation. Initially, three members shall serve a three-year term, three a two-year term and three a one-year term. At the expiration of the initial terms, each member shall be appointed for a two-year term. No person may serve more than two consecutive two-year terms, provided that the City Council may waive this limitation if it is in the best interest of the city to do so. Any vacancy shall be filled by appointment of the Mayor with the consent of the Council, for the unexpired portion of the term. The City Manager or his designee and the City Attorney shall be ad hoc members of the Commission and shall provide staff support as may be reasonably required. Any member may be removed from office for cause.


Read the first time on February 17, 1981, and moved to second reading by majority vote of the City Council.

Read the second time and adopted by the City Council on March 3, 1981.


