

ORDINANCE NO. 1498

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE ESTABLISHING THE MILWAUKIE CENTER ADVISORY BOARD.

THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Milwaukie Center Advisory Board is established with the following duties:

- A. To forward input regarding needs of seniors and the community relative to programs and facilities of The Milwaukie Center to the City Council or the Center Director and Center Program Committee.
- B. To recommend resolutions regarding specific problems and policies referred by the Center Director and the Program Committee.
- C. To recommend policies concerning The Milwaukie Center to the City Council.
- D. To review Center policies regularly.
- E. To provide support for the Center and its programs and projects.

Section 2. The Advisory Board shall consist of nine members appointed by the Mayor with the consent of the City Council, the majority of whom shall be residents of the city. Five members must be over 60 years old and all members shall serve without compensation. Initially, three members shall serve a three-year term, three a two-year term and three a one-year term, as determined by lot. At the expiration of the initial terms, each member shall be appointed for a two-year term. No person may serve more than two consecutive two-year terms, provided that the City Council may waive this limitation if it is in the best interest of the city to do so. Any vacancy shall be filled by appointment by the Mayor, with the consent of the Council, for the unexpired portion of the term. Any member may be removed from office for cause. Terms of office shall expire on June 30.

Section 3. The Advisory Board may adopt its own rules for the appointment of officers and the number and conduct of its meetings. All meetings shall be subject to the requirements of ORS 192.610 to 192.690 (Open Meeting Law). A majority of the members of the Board shall constitute a quorum for the conduct of business and the concurrence of a majority of the members of the Board present shall be required to decide any matter. The Board shall report at least quarterly to the City Council on its activities.






