

RESOLUTION NO. 17-1977

A RESOLUTION ENDORSING THE CONCEPT OF A COOPERATIVE LIBRARY SERVICE AS BEING IN THE BEST INTERESTS OF THE CITY RESIDENTS AND SUPPORTING PASSAGE OF THE LEVY TO BE SUBMITTED AT THE ELECTION TO BE HELD ON TUESDAY, MAY 17, 1977, AND URGING ALL QUALIFIED ELECTORS TO VOTE IN SAID ELECTION.

WHEREAS, Clackamas County currently has no County-wide library system; and

WHEREAS, a comprehensive County-wide library service helps further the educational process, promote public awareness and provide recreational opportunity for all citizens of Clackamas County; and

WHEREAS, an election is scheduled to be held on Tuesday, May 17, 1977 for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of Clackamas County, the question of approving a three year library serial levy for the purposes of re-establishing the bookmobile van service, inter-library loans, union catalogue and to establish a uniform registration system for all library users and to eliminate borrowers' fees; and

WHEREAS, approval of said levy will provide equalization grant monies to the cities in Clackamas County, thereby creating an equitable arrangement of library service funding for both those people residing within city limits and those residing in the unincorporated areas of Clackamas County; and


WHEREAS, equalization grant monies available under the serial levy will allow the City of Milwaukie to discontinue out-of-city user fees and re-open city library facilities to all county residents without discrimination;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of Milwaukie, Oregon endorses the concept of a cooperative library service as being in the best interests of the city residents, and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Council supports passage of the levy to be submitted at the election to be held on Tuesday, May 17, 1977, and urges all qualified electors to vote in said election.


Be it so resolved.

Introduced and adopted by the City Council on the 21st day of April, 1977, at a regular meeting of the City Council.


