

RESOLUTION NUMBER 26-1977

A RESOLUTION EXPRESSING CONCERN OF THE CITY COUNCIL AND ESTABLISHING A VOLUNTARY WATER CONSERVATION PLAN.

WHEREAS, the City of Milwaukie operates and maintains a municipal water system providing water for domestic and industrial purposes to over 18,000 persons through 4,750 service installations, and

WHEREAS, the Pacific Northwest is experiencing weather conditions which are forecasted to place unusual limits on the supply of water throughout the region this summer, and


WHEREAS, the prudent and conservative use of water by all users is important at all times and especially in a time of potential shortage,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City of Milwaukie encourages customers of the Milwaukie water system to practice all practical means of water conservation including:


- installation/adjustment of water flow restrictors on showers and toilets.
- limiting outside water use (lawn watering, car washing, etc.) to alternate calendar days (odd-even) corresponding to address number between June 15 and September 15, 1977.
- limit large water uses (lawn watering, dish washer, showers, etc.) to times other than 5 pm to 10 pm.
- consult with city representatives about special water uses (filling swimming pools, etc.) requiring large amounts of water.

Introduced and adopted by the City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon on the 6th day of June, 1977, at a regular meeting of the City Council.
