

RESOLUTION NO. 48-1979

A RESOLUTION ACCEPTING THE TRANSFER OF JURISDICTION OVER PORTIONS OF OATFIELD ROAD, HARMONY ROAD AND LINWOOD AVENUE WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON.

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of Clackamas County has previously by order No. 77-457 offered to surrender jurisdiction over a portion of Oatfield Road, Harmony Road and Linwood Avenue within the City limits of the City of Milwaukie from Clackamas County to the City of Milwaukie, and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Milwaukie finds that it is in the best interests of the City of Milwaukie to require jurisdiction over said County Roadways located within the jurisdiction of the City of Milwaukie, now, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE:

That the City of Milwaukie accepts jurisdiction over the following:

1. That portion of Oatfield Road, County Market Road No. 34, from the centerline of Lake Road Southwesterly 1,100 feet, more or less, to the Kellogg Creek Bridge, all within the southwest one-quarter of the southeast one-quarter of Section 36, Township 1 South, Range 1 East of the Willamette Meridian.
2. That portion of S.E. Harmony Road, County Road No. 96, extending 200 feet easterly from the intersection

of S.E. Linwood Avenue and S.E. Harmony Road in Section 5, Township 2 South, Range 2 East of the Willamette Meridian.

3. That portion of Linwood Avenue, County Road No. 1643, located in Section 32, Township 1 South, Range 2 East of the Willamette Meridian and Section 5, Township 2 South, Range 2 East of the Willamette Meridian, lying between the northerly limits of the intersection of Southeast Monroe Street and the northerly right-of-way line of the Southern Pacific Transportation Company at S.E. Harmony Road.

all within the City limits of the City of Milwaukie, and hereinafter the City shall have full and absolute jurisdiction over said roadways for the purposes of repair, construction, improvement, and the levying and collection of assessments.



Introduced and adopted by the City Council on the 5th day of November, 1979, at a regular meeting of the City Council.


