

RESOLUTION NO. 4-1995

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, CALLING FOR A SPECIAL ELECTION ON MARCH 28, 1995 FOR THE PURPOSE OF SUBMITTING A THREE-YEAR SERIAL LEVY FOR LIBRARY SERVICES TO THE VOTERS OF THE CITY.

WHEREAS, the Budget Committee has reviewed the 1994-95 financial situation of the City of Milwaukie; and

WHEREAS, the existing Library Services Serial Levy expires on June 30, 1995; and

WHEREAS, additional revenue sources are required to prevent reductions to current service levels; and

WHEREAS, the Budget Committee has recommended to City Council that a Library Services Serial Levy be referred to the voters of the City; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing was held on January 5, 1995 pursuant to ORS 310.186 to discuss the impact of a proposed increase in current tax levy authority for the City of Milwaukie.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon that:

SECTION 1. An election is hereby called in and for the City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon on Tuesday, March 28, 1995, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of the City the question of establishing a three-year serial levy.

SECTION 2. The following ballot is hereby approved and shall be printed on the official ballot as set forth below:

CAPTION: THREE-YEAR OPERATING SERIAL LEVY FOR LIBRARY SERVICES

QUESTION: Shall Milwaukie levy \$200,000 each year for three years outside the tax base for library services beginning in 1995-1996?

SUMMARY: The Ledding Library has provided service to the people of the City of Milwaukie for nearly thirty years. The library has over 98,900 books, tapes, videos and other items in its circulation. The annual circulation of these items is in excess of 300,000. Passage of this levy allows Ledding Library to stay at its current service levels. The library would continue to be open on Sundays and Thursday evenings. In addition, the levy would pay for reference resources and lease or purchase of best selling books. The proposed levy replaces a levy approved by the voters on June 30, 1992. That levy ends on June 30, 1995. The total amount of the serial levy would be \$600,000 over a three year period.

The estimated tax rate for this levy is \$0.1824 for this levy. The estimated tax cost for this measure is an ESTIMATE ONLY based on the best information available from the County Tax Assessor at the time of the estimate.

The tax levy is subject to the limits of Section 11b, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution and the revenues raised will be used for governmental purposes other than schools.

Approval of this measure may reduce the property tax collections of other non-school district units of government available under the provisions of Section 11b, Article XI of the Oregon Constitution and implementing legislation.


SECTION 3. The election shall be conducted by the Clackamas County Elections Department, which department shall establish polling places, precincts, and election boards for such election. The election may be conducted by mail pursuant to ORS 254.465 et seq.

SECTION 4. The City Recorder is hereby authorized and directed to certify in the manner provided for by law to the Elections Director of Clackamas County, Oregon, the foregoing measure for inclusion as a part of the regular ballots to be prepared by the Elections Director for voting at all precincts within the City of Milwaukie at the special election on March 28, 1995.


SECTION 5. The City Recorder shall be, and is hereby further authorized and directed to give notice of receipt of the ballot title as required by ORS 250.275, by publishing in the Clackamas County Review on January 26, 1995.

SECTION 6. The City Recorder shall be, and is hereby further ordered and directed to post notice of said election in a conspicuous place in City Hall. This notice shall be posted at least ten (10) days before the date set for the election. The City Recorder shall give additional notice of the aforesaid City election by publication at least once in a newspaper of general circulation in the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, the first publication to be not less than ten (10) days before the election. The notice shall contain the ballot title under which the question will appear on the ballot and shall set forth the time and place of said election.
