

**A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON,
ESTABLISHING FISCAL YEAR 1999-2000 NORTH CLACKAMAS
PARKS AND RECREATION DISTRICT (NCPRD) MILWAUKIE
NEIGHBORHOOD PARKS FUNDING.**

WHEREAS, the City of Milwaukie has an intergovernmental agreement (IGA) with the NCPRD;

WHEREAS, the NCPRD may undertake improvements to parks currently under the jurisdiction of the City of Milwaukie subject to the approval of the City Council, or its designee;

WHEREAS, the City of Milwaukie has existing master plans for Ardenwald, Scott, Furnberg, Water Tower and Wichita Parks;

WHEREAS, in the IGA, the City of Milwaukie has listed as possible projects for neighborhood parks funding the acquisition of land for neighborhood or mini-parks, build neighborhood parks, build mini-parks or vest parks, improve or rehabilitate existing parks, expand existing parks facilities, etc.;

WHEREAS, the Milwaukie Park and Recreation Board (PARB) is an advisory board to the City Council;

WHEREAS, the PARB met on Monday, January 4, 1999, at 6:30 PM and developed and prioritized projects for funding for the NCPRD fiscal year 1999-2000 budget, for Milwaukie neighborhood parks;

WHEREAS, the City Council and the PARB met in public work sessions on Tuesday, January 19, 1999 and Monday, February 1, 1999, to discuss proposed projects for NCPRD funding in fiscal year 1999-2000;


NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Milwaukie that the following prioritized list of projects and programs for 1999-2000 shall receive NCPRD neighborhood capital improvement funds and NCPRD operations and capital improvement funds in fiscal year 1999-2000 in the listed priority order:

Fiscal Year 1999-2000:

1. Fund land acquisition for Neighborhood Parks and pocket parks, Community and Regional Parks, wetlands and open spaces and trails.
 - 1.1. Acquire additional land for neighborhood park development. First priority to be given to the Hector Campbell neighborhood, second to the Lewelling neighborhood and third to the area west of 32nd Avenue in the Ardenwald neighborhood.

- 1.2. Acquire additional land for Community or Regional Parks for ballfields and skateboarding/rollerblading.
- 1.3. Acquire lands to maintain and enhance wetlands and open spaces.
- 1.4. Acquire land for trails to connect existing and future parks, wetlands, open spaces and trails and the neighborhoods to the downtown and riverfront.
2. Upgrade existing facilities to meet expanding needs.
 - 2.1. Furnberg Park -- using Metro Open Spaces funding complete wetlands and in future years, construct the boardwalk.
 - 2.2. Water Tower Park -- complete construction as per master plan.
 - 2.3. Century Park -- reconstruct the tennis court.
 - 2.4. Wichita Park -- construction as per master plan.
 - 2.5. Spring Park -- develop master plan with the Island Station Neighborhood Association and construct pocket park near entrance.
 - 2.6. Dogwood Park/McLoughlin -- develop master plan in conjunction with riverfront and downtown master planning process.
 - 2.7. Elk Rock Island -- annex into the City and implement the adopted management plan.
3. Construct and/or acquire facilities for the operation and maintenance of youth activities to include elements such as a Skateboard/rollerblade Park and Youth Center. Accomplish all tasks through creating partnerships with other governmental agencies and private and non-profits entities as well as volunteer efforts.
4. Develop recreation and leisure programs through partnerships with citizens, other governmental entities and public and private entities.
 - 4.1. Provide for preschool and school age activities.
 - 4.2. Provide structured events in the summer throughout the community for all ages.
 - 4.3. Continue and expand the concert in the park programs
5. Continue to expand on educational and volunteer activities especially as they relate to wetlands and open spaces.


