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**WHEREAS**, on November 18, 1998, the City of Milwaukie received notice from the Department of State Police that a Drug Recognition Expert (DRE) Call-Out Funding grant was available to the City, and

**WHEREAS**, Oregon Revised Statutes section 294.326(2) states that Expenditures in the year of receipt of grants transferred in trust for a specific purpose may be made after enactment of a resolution or ordinance authorizing the expenditure.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE  
CITY OF MILWAUKIE THAT:**


**SECTION 1:** The City of Milwaukie hereby accepts a \$2,000 DRE Call-Out Funding grant issued through the Oregon State Police and the Department of Transportation Traffic Safety Division.

**SECTION 2:** The City Council determines that the grant is a specific purpose grant.

**SECTION 3:** In accordance with ORS 294.326(2) the awarded grant funds are appropriated as follows:

RE: Drug Recognition Expert (DRE) Call-Out Funding

On October 1, 1998, the Oregon State Police and the Department of Transportation Traffic Safety Division again entered into a grant agreement to fund the Oregon DRE program. The agreement includes paid funding for DRE training, materials, overtime call-out for conducting a drug evaluation of a suspected drug-impaired driver and court overtime associated with appearance and/or testimony related to a DRE case.

As in the past, the grant is intended to encourage the use of the DRE's whenever possible in the detection and identification of suspected drug-impaired drivers. In some jurisdictions, the use of DRE's on overtime has been restricted or not approved due to strict overtime limitations. Hopefully, the DRE grant will assist in that area.

As with the previous grant, some restrictions do apply. They include the following:

1. Only DRE's who have attended and successfully completed the NHTSA/IACP Drug Evaluation and Classification Program (DECP) training are eligible for the overtime funding. If there are questions or concerns regarding certification, please contact me.
2. Funding only applies when conducting a drug evaluation on suspected drug-impaired driver or when appearing in court on a DRE related case.
3. The agency and DRE requesting the overtime payment must submit a completed Drug Evaluation report with the overtime request when the request is for an evaluation of a suspected drug-impaired driver.
4. The DRE must submit a DRE Overtime Funding Request form (See attached form). If the overtime request is for a court appearance on a DRE case, the form must indicate the suspect and case number.
5. The grant does not allow for overtime payments for callbacks from vacation or other leave that would constitute double time and a half payment.



DRE Call-Out Funding


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6. The overtime funding does not allow for overtime payment for DRE training, unless the training involves a drug-impaired driving arrest.

**The grant funding from ODOT is available through September 30, 1999.**
