

The Movie Maven Presents: The Films of Autumn

Finally, those 90 degree days of summer are behind us (Let's hope!). There's rain in the forecast and Halloween decorations in the store. It's fall: time for corduroy, stews and the holidays. Take a look at these films, set in autumn, to enjoy with your hot apple cider:

Hannah and Her Sisters (1986): This oddly touching film takes place between two Thanksgivings, as Elliott (Michael Caine) falls in love with his wife's sister, Lee. One of Woody Allen's finest, which earned a Best Screenplay Oscar as well as a Best Supporting Actor award for Michael Caine.

Far From Heaven (2002): Portland's Todd Haynes has created a poignant and cinematically beautiful film about a 1950's housewife whose world is shattered when she discovers that her husband is leading a secret life. A tear-jerker of the

50's, starring Julianne Moore and Dennis Quaid.

Rushmore (1998): From the warped and brilliant mind of director Wes Anderson, the tale of Max Fischer (Jason Schwartzman), the extracurricular king of Rushmore Preparatory School. His life changes when he is put on academic probation and falls for a pretty teacher.

On Golden Pond (1981): Henry Fonda won a Best Actor Oscar for his role in this tender story of enduring love, family conflict, and resolution. Katherine Hepburn and Jane Fonda co-star. This was Henry's last theatrical film.

One True Thing (1998): This beautifully acted and poignant movie, based on the novel by Anna Quindlen, has career girl Ellen (Renee Zellweger) having to reassess her parent's lives when she becomes a caregiver for her seriously ill mother (Meryl Streep).

Also on the list...

Rudy (1993): A young man overcomes the odds to play football for Notre Dame.

Halloween (1978): The original John Carpenter scare fest.

Harold and Maude (1971): Cult classic of a very unusual love affair.

Days of Heaven (1978): An early Terrence Malick work of greed and vengeance.

The Sixth Sense (1999): An engaging ghost story with a major twist.

Pieces of April (2003): A wayward daughter tries to reconcile with her family at Thanksgiving.

Tess (1979): A love triangle in Victorian England.
