The following is a description of Lewellyn Park in meets and bounds.

Beginning at an iron monument described as the initial point of Lewellyn Park, in Clackamas County, Oregon, said initial point being 188.84 feet East, 19.52 feet South and 727 feet S.  $80^{\circ}28'$  W. and 2.4 feet South  $8^{\circ}58'$  E. from the common Section Corner of Sections 25, and 26, and 35 and 36 in T.1, S. of R. 1E. of Willamette Meridan, thence S.  $80^{\circ}58'$  E. 430 feet; Thence N.  $81^{\circ}02'$  E. 725.2 feet; thence N.  $8^{\circ}58'$  W. 380 feet; thence S.  $80^{\circ}10'$  W. 336.79 feet; thence N.  $8^{\circ}58'$  W. 54.6 feet; thence S.  $81^{\circ}02'$  W. 390 feet to the place of beginning.

Town Hall Milwaukie Ore.

Oct. 4<sup>th</sup> 1909

A Special meeting of the Common Council was called to order by Mayor Streit. All the Councilman, the Marshal and Records being present:

The call for the meeting was read by the Recorder. The same being a request from the Milwaukie Commercial Club for the Council to receive a report and some suggestions from the Club for their consideration. The following was the report received

That Section 7, of the Charter of the Town of Milwaukie be amended so as to read "The Marshal shall give ten days' notice of each election by posting in three public places and publishing in a paper printed in Milwaukie if there be one, two successive weeks, giving the time, place of holding the election and the names of the Judges and Clerks of the said election."

That Sec. 8, of the Charter of the Town of Milwaukie be amended, so as to read: "No person is qualified to vote at elections held under the Charter of <sup>the</sup> said town who has not been a resident of the town of Milwaukie three (3) months and who does not possess the qualifications of a legal voter of the State of Oregon."

That paragraph 1 of Sec 22 of the Charter of the Town of Milwaukee be amended by adding the following provision: "Provided that the council may make a special road levy not to exceed three tenths of one per cent of the taxable property within said incorporation."

That paragraph 26 of Sec. 22 be amended by adding the following proviso: "Provided that the people of Milwaukee may, for public improvements, including sewers, water works or other street improvements create an indebtedness in excess of \$1000." when a majority of the people vote upon such measures shall be in the affirmative, either by direct taxation or by the sale of bonds."

That Sec. 42 be repealed and the following enacted in its stead:  
 "A copy of such ordinance submitted by the Council or proposed thereby shall be posted in the post office in said town and published in a newspaper printed in said town if there be one, two successive weeks before being passed to final reading by the Council, and after being passed by the Council and signed by the Mayor and Recorder shall immediately become a law. Provided that if the Mayor

shall fail to sign or veto the same within three days of the passage thereof, the same shall become a law without said signature.

That the Charter of the Town of Milwaukee be amended by adding another Section, to-wit: Section 46, to read: The Council shall divide said Town of Milwaukee into not less than four wards, each of which shall be entitled to representation upon said Council.

The various sections were read and compared to the sections as they now are in the Charter, and were adopted one by one, until proposed section 46 was reached and after some discussion by the members of the Council it was decided to not recommend same to the voters as it would incur too much expense at the elections.

The petition requesting the Council to submit to the voters at the next election the matter of annexing what is known as Sewelling Park to Milwaukee was taken up and upon motion the Recorder was instructed to have said proposition put upon the ballots at the next election.
