

COUNCIL CHAMBER, TOWN HALL AUGUST 27th. 1910.

The adjourned meeting of the Regular Meeting of Aug. 9th. was called to order by Recorder Dowling. Mr. Bolstad was appointed temporary Recorder and Mr. O. Olsen temporary Marshal. Present Councilman Kelso, Mullan and Lehman.

Ordinance No. 44 was taken up for passage and read for first reading. The ordinary rules were suspended and the Ordinance was passed to the SECOND and THIRD readings, duly and unanimously approved by the Councilman present and signed by the Recorder as Acting Mayor. and ordered to become a law in full force and effect.

Ordinance No. 45 was taken up for first reading, Councilman Lehman offered an amendmant to same changing the height of the grade in certain places the amendmant was adopted by the Council and the Ordinance passed to the SECOND and THIRD readings, was duly and unanimously approved by the Councilman present and signed by the Recorder as Acting Mayor, and ordered to become a law in full force and effect.

Ordinance No. 46 was taken up for First reading, the ordinary rules were suspended and the Ordinance was passed to the SECOND and THIRD readings, duly and unanimously approved by the Councilman present and signed by the Recorder as Acting Mayor, and ordered to become a law in full force and effect.

The following resolution was offered by Councilman Lehman, and upon motion by Lehman 2nd. by Mullan was adopted by the Council.
 2-1910 RESOLUTION: Whereas a considerable number of the property owners abutting on Main St. in the Town of Milwaukie are constructing concrete sidewalks in conformity with the Ordinances governing the same, and whereas it is desirable and necessary that the sidewalks along Main St. in said town be placed in good condition and of a uniform material and grade: Resolved by the Council of the Town of Milwaukie that the Recorder of said town immediately notify the owners of all property abutting on Main St. who have not at this date made application to do so to at once construct sidewalks in front of their property on said Main St. in accordance with the Ordinances governing same, and if the same is not completed within 30 days from the date of said notice that the Council will order the walks built and place a lien against the property benefited to cover all costs of the same.

Mr. O. Wissinger called attention to the fact that some fences and parts of buildings were extending into the street, the councilmen favored having same moved back to the property line.

Mr. Campbell called the attention of the Council to the fact that at the meeting of the Milwaukie Commercial Club a committee was appointed to work in conjunction with a committee from the Council on revising the Charter. Moved by Mullan 2nd. by Lehman that the chair appoint a committee on charter revision the chair appointed the Street & Public Property Committee of the Council.

On Motion the City Atty. was instructed to draft an Ordinance permanently establishing certain monuments on Main St.

Councilman Mullan said that he had investigated the matter of the location of Harrison St. and could see no other way or place for the street but where it had been located and established by the County officials in the year 1884 locating same with the Claim Line as the center of the Road. On Motion by Mullan 2nd. by Lehman that the Recorder be instructed to notify the property owners to move their fences back to the line on Harrison Street.
