Statement of Significance

ADDRESS: 9911 S.E. Cambridge Lane

This house is significant for its association with architect Jamieson Parker, who designed and lived in it for many years. His versatile designs found expression in many notable public buildings, as well as churches and residences, throughout Oregon. Parker is believed to have designed several homes in the Waverly neighborhood in addition to his own. He served as president of the Portland Chapter of the American Institute of Architecture during the twenties.

The subject house was constructed in 1923 in the Colonial Revival style. It is oriented to the west away from the street and is screened from view by dense plant materials. The building appears to be virtually unaltered since construction. Notable features include the full-width recessed porch on the facade which is balanced by a row of shed and gabled dormers above. The house is illuminated by multi-light, double-hung sash windows with vertical board shutters. A small single bay porch is located on the east elevation. The building is sheathed in lap siding.


