

MEETING OF MARCH 24, 1942.
(Cont'd)

It was moved by Newman and seconded by Kemmerer that the Bid of Richfield Oil Corporation to furnish the City with Kerosene at \$.1037 per gallon, for a period commencing March 1 1942 and ending December 31, 1942, be accepted. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Newman and seconded by Kemmerer that the City have a telephone installed in the Mayor's office in the City Hall, to be used as a Central Station private phone for Civilian Defense. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Kemmerer and seconded by Walden that the City discontinue paying for electric power for the W.P.A. sewing room and that the Recorder notify the Portland General Electric Co. and the W.P.A. administrators to that effect. Motion carried and so ordered.

Mr. Burbank brought to the attention of the Council the condition of a building on the river bank, and stated that it was not only a fire hazard but was being used by hobos. The Recorder was directed to notify Kronberg Bros, agents for the property, of these conditions and request them to have the building demolished.

It was moved by Sperr and seconded by Walden that the City pay (75¢) seventy-five cents per hour for labor in the Street and Water departments. Motion carried and so ordered.

Mr. Walden and Mr. Burbank were appointed to make investigation of parking conditions in the business district and recommend to the Council what restrictions should be made.

Ordinance Number 424 AN ORDINANCE prescribing rates on water, effective May 1, 1942, regulating the payment of water bills, and repealing Ordinances Numbered 375 and 401 and all other ordinances in conflict herewith; was taken up for the first time and read. Ordinance Number 424 was read the second and third times by title only with the consent of the Council and put on its passage with the following results being had. Ayes: Newman, Walden, Sperr, and Kemmerer. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 424 was passed by the Council.

It was moved by Sperr and seconded by Kemmerer that the Recorder be authorized to transfer eleven dollars from Sanitary Service to the Marshal salary in the General fund, and forty dollars from Supervisors Insurance in the Street fund. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Newman and seconded by Walden that the following bills be allowed and that the Recorder be directed to issue warrants for the payment of same.

556th. MEETING.

The minutes of the five hundred fifty-fifth regular meeting of the Council held on the thirteenth day of April 1942 were read and approved as read.

It was decided that Friday, May 22, 1942, at 7 P.M. in the Council chamber at the City Hall would be the time and place of the meeting of the Budget Committee.

The Mayor gave a report of the meeting of the League of Clackamas County Cities, held in Milwaukie April 17.

River Vista
Mr. B.R. Henry asked if the Council was ready to consider the matter of the street leading to River Vista. Mr. Kemmerer reported that he and other members of the Council had made a survey of the street and that in his opinion, the west end was not in condition to be accepted by the Council as water running down the hill would soon cause expense to the City, and suggested that suitable gutters to carry off the water, be put on each side of the road.

It was moved by Walden and seconded by Kemmerer that the City purchase a map of Portland Metropolitan Area at a cost of \$17.50. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 425 entitled "AN ORDINANCE providing for the regulation of persons, firms, or corporations engaged in transporting persons for hire, and repealing conflicting ordinance provisions" was taken up for consideration and read for the first time.
