5. Provide adequate ventilation from the outside to the boiler room.
6. Complete the wiring in the boiler room to comply with the State Electrical Code.
7. Provide a one hour fire door with a self closing device on the boiler room.

These orders were written on the already existing building and a number of recommendations were made regarding stairways and exits in the portion of the building under construction.

The writer will keep in contact with the building Committee of the Church as the building progresses.

ADJOURNED MEETING OF JANUARY 11, 1952

An adjourned meeting of the Council was held at 5 o'clock P.M. on the eleventh day of January, 1952

The meeting, which was held for the purpose of re-examining the low bids for the City's liability insurance, after all breakdowns had been made, and equipment added, was called to order by Mayor Sperr.

Present: Mayor Sperr; Councilmen Mullan, Klein and Norbeck. Manager Telford, Attorney Kirkpatrick and Recorder Martin. Absent: Councilman Taylor. Manager Telford was detained and did not arrive until after the call to order.

Manager Telford had anticipated that he would be delayed and had therefor submitted a written report of his findings and his recommendation for acceptance of the bid, stating that Mr. Richard Groener had confirmed his verbal increases given at the Council meeting of January 7, and that he had complied with all requirements, and that up to 11:30 A.M. of January 11, he had been the only one to comply.

It was moved by Klein and seconded by Mullan that all bids be rejected. There was considerable discussion on the motion, during such discussion Mr. Telford arrived at the meeting. Upon the motion being put to vote the following results were had. Ayes: Two. Nays: Two. The motion failed to pass the Council.

During the discussion it was shown that Mr. Groener had complied with all requests made by the Council, that the City had enjoyed a courteous treatment from the Pacific Employers Insurance Company during the past year, that he had a complete breakdown in his original bid, but that he had not included the piece of fire equipment the City expects to be delivered to them about March 1, that his reason for not having included it was that it would be pro-rated and could be added later, that his revised bid was the low bid if the quantities were extended one way, but that Mr. Loder's bid was a little lower when Groener's bid was figured another way.

After considerable discussion and considering all things pertaining to the bids it was moved by Norbeck and seconded by Sperr that the Council follow the Manager's recommendation and that the bid for Liability insurance be awarded to Mr. Richard E. Groener, agent for Pacific Employers Insurance Co. at a cost of \$1,367.93. The motion was put with the following results being had Ayes: Four. Nays: None. The Mayor declared the motion carried and it was so ordered.

On motion duly made and carried the meeting adjourned.
