

MEETING OF JANUARY 8, 1945

COUNCIL CHAMBERS

620 MEETING

The six hundred twentieth regular meeting of the Council was held on the eighth day of January 1945.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Roberts.

Present: Mayor Roberts, Councilmen Hamlin, Bevington, Sperr and Rowe; Treasurer Walcott, Water Superintendant Counsell, Officer Butler and Recorder Martin. Absent: Councilman McClure and Fire Chief Lewellyn.

Mayor Roberts and Councilmen Hamlin and Sperr were sworn to their respective offices by the Recorder.

The minutes of the six hundred nineteenth regular meeting of the Council held on the twenty-ninth day of December 1944, were read and corrected.

Mr. A. Boitano came before the Council and stated that owing to the condition of his health he had sold the Milwaukie Sanitary Service to Mr. George Deering and Mr. Wm. Spady. The new owners made application for a three years' franchise to operate the Milwaukie Sanitary Service and agreed that they would continue the business in the same efficient and cooperative manner and at the same fees as Mr. Boitano. It was moved by Sperr and seconded by Bevington that an ordinance be prepared and posted granting to Milwaukie Sanitary Service a three years franchise at Twenty-five (\$25.00) dollars per year, for garbage disposal in Milwaukie. Motion carried and so ordered.

Mr. Hans Christen came before the Council and presented petitions requesting that the license fee for Milwaukie Sanitarium be lowered to a sum comparable to that charged in Portland, for similar businesses. After some discussion a petition was presented to the Council, through the Recorder, signed by residents of Streib's First Addition, requesting the City to give them added police protection and street lighting, because of mental inmates from the Milwaukie Sanitarium being an annoyance and a nuisance also a menace and hazard to traffic in that area. The Council gave consideration to discussion from Mr. Christian and the Mayor called upon those in the audience who cared to voice their views. The Mayor then called upon members of the Council. The general opinion was that the Council felt that in the interest of the public safety that Mr. Christian should operate his Sanitarium in a manner so as not to be a nuisance to the community nor an added expense to the City, that he should operate it in a manner so as to be above reproach. It was moved by Rowe and seconded by Sperr that the petitions be filed and the license fee for the Convalescent Home remain the same as in the past. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Bevington and seconded by Hamlin that the City give Mr. Henry Wiseman the old grill work from the counter in the City Business office. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 459, AN ORDINANCE prohibiting the moving of buildings without first obtaining a permit from the Council and providing a penalty, was taken up and read for the first time. Ordinance Number 459 was read the second and third times by title only, with the consent of the Council, and put on its passage with the following results being had. Ayes: Hamlin, Bevington, Sperr and Rowe. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 459 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

The Recorder brought to the attention of the Council the fact that Lot 14 Block 12 Quincy Addition, would be sold at auction by the County on January 16. The Council considered that in as much as the City owns Lot 15 Block 12 Quincy Addition, and in the event they were to build a water tower there, they would need more land. It was moved by Sperr and seconded by Hamlin that the Recorder attend the sale and bid not to exceed \$200.00 for Lot 14 Block 12 Quincy Addition. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Fire Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

It was moved by Rowe and seconded by Hamlin that the Recorder write a letter to Portland Traction Co. asking them to maintain a waiting room in Milwaukie. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Bevington and seconded by Sperr that the Portland Gas and Coke Co. be permitted to baracade a section of Main St. to make excavation in same in order to locate a leak in their main. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Mayor appointed Mr. Hamlin as commissioner of City Hall and Parks and stated that the other Commissioners would remain as were.

It was moved by Rowe and seconded by Sperr that the following bills be allowed and that the Recorder be directed to issue warrants for the payment of same.
