MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON, HELD ON THE EIGHTH DAY OF JANUARY, 1962

COUNCIL CHAMBER

966TH MEETING.

The nine hundred sixty-sixth regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, was held in the Council Chamber at the City Hall in Milwaukie, Oregon, on the eighth day of January, 1962, commencing at the hour of 7:30 o'clock P.M., Pacific Standard Time.

The meeting was duly called to order by Mayor Earl M. Clay, Chairman of the Council.

The roll was called by Council Clerk Ellen Martin.

Those present were: Mayor Earl M. Clay; Councilmen Ernest H. Aebi, Charles Renard, Theron E. Sedgwick and James M. Howard, being all the members of the City Council.

Also present at the meeting were City Manager Leonard B. Mullan, City Attorney John O. Sheldahl and Council Clerk Ellen Martin.

The minutes of the nine hundred sixty-fifth regular meeting of the Council, held on the eleventh day of December, 1961, were approved as written.

Mrs. Vera Randall, 9250 -40th Street came before the Council and reported that she had disposed of all but eight pigeons and fifteen chickens, that she still has two dogs and five cats, but that she would dispose of one of the cats very soon. Mrs. Randall was advised that she must clean the chicken house and keep her place free of obnoxious odors.

Sylvia Ommert, owner of the W $\frac{1}{2}$ ly  $\frac{1}{2}$  of the N $\frac{1}{2}$ ly  $\frac{1}{2}$  of Lot 7, Rockwood Acres and the E $\frac{1}{2}$ ly  $\frac{1}{2}$  of the N $\frac{1}{2}$ ly  $\frac{1}{2}$  except 20 feet of Lot 7, Rockwood Acres, came before the Council and stated that she was out of town at the time the notice for the Ardenwald Area "C" sewer assessment was sent to her, and was ill at the time set for bonding for the same, and was requesting that she be permitted to bond at this time. It was moved by Councilman Howard and seconded by Councilman Sedgwick that Mrs. Sylvia Ommert be permitted to bond her property, without penalty, for the Ardenwald Area "C" Sewer assessment and that the Recorder be authorized to antedate the bond to September 20, 1961 in the following amounts:

It was moved by Councilman Howard and seconded by Councilman Sedgwick that the bids be referred to the City Manager for investigation and that the contracts be awarded to the lowest responsible bidder and that the Mayor be authorized to sign the contracts. Motion carried and so ordered.

The time having arrived the Mayor opened the hearing on the annexation of territory as described in Ordinance No. 867 and called for any objection to the annexation. There was no person present who made objection and no written objection had been received. The Mayor declared the hearing closed.

Ordinance Number 874 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Councilman Howard and seconded by Councilman Sedgwick that Ordinance No. 874 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 874 AN ORDINANCE annexing certain territory contiguous to the present boundaries of the City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon, and fixing the effective date of such annexation, was again taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following result being had. Ayes: Howard, Renard, Aebi, Sedgwick and Clay. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 874 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.




