

It was moved, seconded and carried that a three mill tax be levied for the year 1911. It was ordered that the Recorder purchased two cords of wood for the City Hall. Mr. J.W. Grasle reported that the foot bridge across Kellogg Lake had been completed and that they were short \$25 in the subscription pledged for the construction of the same, and asked the City Council to appropriate \$25 in order to complete the payments.

On motion it was ordered that the \$25 be appropriated and the Recorder was instructed to make an entry showing that the \$50 appropriated by order of the Council October 11, 1910, as a subscription to said fund by raising to \$75 and that the Recorder issued a warrant in said amount in favor of the First State Bank of Milwaukie, Oregon, on account of said pledge fund. Mr. Grasle stated that there were several subscribers to this fund who had failed to pay their subscription and should said subscription be paid, the last \$25 appropriated by the City Council of Milwaukie would be returned to the Treasury of Milwaukie.

On motion the City Recorder was instructed to write the Milwaukie Water Co. requesting them to make a report in writing to the City Council of exact number of faucets now instalated and in use in Milwaukie, said report to be filed in the office of the Recorder on or before January 10, 1911. There being no further business on motion the Council adjourned.

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TOWN HALL MILWAUKIE, OREGON JANUARY 10, 1911.

The (106) regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was called to order by Mayor Streib, roll called showed the following officers present: Philip Streib, Mayor, and Councilmen W.F. Lehman, J.R.Kelso, Warren Knight and Chas. T. Stockton. In the absence of the Recorder, A.H.Dowling was appointed recorder pro tem. The minutes of the (105) regular meeting of the City Council were read and approved. The following bills were allowed and warrants were ordered drawn on the Treasurer in payment thereof:

The Mayor's Annual report was read and showed a total expenditure for the year 1910 of \$3,291.06 and the Total receipts \$5,063.88, leaving a balance for the year \$1,844.82. The Mayor prepared no message other than announcement made before the election of what he stood for and hoped to work for those things namely: Better Streets and Side Walks. Immediate improvement of Front Street, Harrison Street, Foster Road, Main Street, and Washington Street, they being the principal streets in the Town. Concrete cross walks built by the town from the general fund. The purchase of a Street Roller and Rock Crusher by the town (to be submitted to the vote of the people). More Street lights as they are needed, a new Steel bridge across Johnson Creek, on Front Street to be built by Clackamas County. An ordinance regulating pool rooms, increasing the saloon License fee. No more saloons than at present and strict enforcement of the stock law. The Mayor announced the following committee appointments: FINANCE COMMITTEE, W.F. Lehman, G.R. Kelso, Warren Knight. HEALTH AND PLUMBING COMMITTEE, Chas. T. Stockton, W.F. Lehman, Warren Knight. STREET AND PUBLIC PROPERTY, J.R. Kelso, Warren Knight, W.F. Lehman, LIGHT AND WATER Chas. T. Stockton, W.F. Lehman, and J.R. Kelso. POLICE AND LICENSE Warren Knight, J.R. Kelso, Chas. T. Stockton.

On motion made by Councilman Kelso and 2nd by Stockton it was ordered that the thanks of the City Council be extended to retiring Councilman Mullan for his efficient work and that the Recorder be instructed to so notify Mr. Mullan.

The Mothers Club requested the use of the City Hall for an entertainment and drama, the proceeds to go to the boys club on motion the request was granted.
