

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON. JAN. 12TH. 1915.

The one hundred fifty-fourth regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Pelton. Present, Mayor Pelton, councilmen, Grastle, Pond, Peery and Counsell, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Riley. The minutes of the one hundred fifty-third regular meeting of the Council held on the 8th day of December, 1914, and the minutes of the adjourned meetings of the one fifty-third regular meeting, held on the 9th, 15th, 18th, and 28th ~~day~~ of December, 1914, and on the 2nd day of January, 1915, were read and approved.

Councilman Grastle of the Street Committee reported that the objection of the Oregon and California railroad Company to the apportionment of its share of the cost of the improvement of Laurel Avenue had been adjusted, as it was a mistake in the amount stated in the notice of proposed assessment send to the said Company.

Upon motion duly made and carried, ordinance No. 122, entitle, "An ordinance declaring the assessment for the improvement of Laurel Avenue in the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, from the west line of Cleveland Avenue to the easterly line of a street commonly known as Railroad Avenue, and declaring an emergency," was read and ordered posted as required by the City Charter. Upon motion of councilman Grastle seconded by councilman Counsell and carried, ordinance No. 123 entitled, "An ordinance authorizing the issuance of improvement bonds in pursuance of sections 3245, 3246, ~~3247~~, 3248, 3249, 3250, 3251, 3252 and 3253 Lord's Oregon Laws, and declaring an emergency," was read and a copy ordered posted as required by City Charter,

A report of the Fire Commissioners recommending the purchase of a fire siren and the installing of the same, and the completion of the fire alarm system was read and upon motion duly made and carried, was adopted as read.

A communication from Harry Ameele in regard to assessment against his property for the improvement of Monroe Street was read and referred to Street Committee. A communication from F. T. Roysen requesting the City to refund \$125.00 license fees was read and referred to License Committee. Giebisch & Joplin having filed a satisfactory bond with the City for installing the water system, upon motion of councilman Grastle seconded by councilman Counsell and carried, the Recorder was instructed to deliver to them the certified ~~which~~ they deposited with the City. The application of Mr. Morris for the position of Engineer for the Town was referred to Finance Committee. A communication from the Milwaukie Commercial Club in regard to renaming the Streets was read and referred to the Street Committee. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Mayor was instructed to notify the Marshal to enforce Ordinance No. 12.

The matter of the Carver Franchise was referred to Street Committee. Ordinance 124 was read and a copy ordered posted as required by the City Charter. Upon motion of councilman Bond seconded by councilman Counsell and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draft an ordinance prohibiting the spitting on the sidewalks and public buildings in the Town of Milwaukie.

The following bills were read and allowed by the Finance Committee, and upon motion of councilman Peery seconded by Counsell and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants in payment of the same:
