

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, JAN. 13TH. 1930.

The three hundred thirty-fourth regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the 13th. day of January, 1930. Meeting called to order by Mayor Miller. Present, Mayor Miller, Councilmen Shindler, Sanders, Dean, Earl and Dell, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. The minutes of the three hundred thirty-third regular meeting of the Council held on the 9th. day of December, 1929, and the minutes of the adjourned meeting of the three hundred thirty-third regular meeting of the Council held on the 23rd. day of December, 1929, were read and approved as read. There being no objections made or filed against the proposed assessment for the construction of the Myrtle Street Sewer, upon motion duly made and carried, Ordinance No. 301 entitled, "An ordinance declaring the assessment for the construction of the Myrtle Street Sewer in Milwaukie, Oregon, and declaring an emergency," was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read the roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Shindler, Sanders, Dean, Earl and Dell. Noes, none. Ordinance No. 301 passed the first reading.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and Ordinance No. 301 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Shindler, Sanders, Dean, Earl and Dell. Noes, none. Ordinance No. 301 passed the second reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 301 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. The roll call showed the following result: Ayes, Shindler, Sanders, Dean, Earl and Dell. Noes, none. Ordinance No. 301 passed the third and final reading.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Mayor and Recorder were instructed to draw warrants on the Myrtle Street Sewer fund for the amount due the Contractor for the construction of said sewer. Upon motion duly made and carried, the City Treasurer was instructed to transfer \$20.00 from the Street fund into the Willard Street Extension fund in order to take up the warrant drawn on the Willard Street extension fund and held by R. S. Milln.

Upon motion duly made and carried, it was ordered that the City purchase a card index system of book keeping for the City Treasurer. The following bills were read and allowed by the Finance Committee, and upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants in payment of the same:
