

MEETING OF FEBRUARY 27, 1956

COUNCIL CHAMBERS

887th MEETING

The eight hundred eighty-seventh regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the twenty-seventh day of February, 1956

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Mullan.

Present: Mayor Mullan; Councilmen Clay, Perkins, Shook, and Klein; Manager Burdick and Recorder Martin. Absent: Attorney Sheldahl.

The minutes of the eight hundred eighty-sixth regular meeting of the Council, held on the thirteenth day of February, 1956 were approved as written.

The minutes of a special meeting of the Council, held on the eighteenth day of February, 1956, were approved as written.

A petition, signed by eleven property owners along 21st Street south of Washington Street, requesting that 21st Street, from Washington Street to Lake Road, be improved by curbs and sidewalks, was laid before the Council. After some discussion, it was decided to lay the petition on the table until the next regular meeting of the Council on March 12, 1956 .

Ordinance Number 636 was taken up and read in full for its first reading. It was moved by Klein and seconded by Shook that Ordinance No 636 be passed to its second reading. Motion carried and so ordered.

This being the time set for the hearing on the matter of annexation of Lots 20 to 32 inclusive, Block 82 and Lots 16 to 23 inclusive, Block 87, all in Minthorn Addition to the City of Portland, and all being contiguous to the City of Milwaukie, and notices of the hearing having been published in the Milwaukie Review, and posted in the City of Milwaukie, the Mayor called for objections to the proposed annexation of the above mentioned territory. There was no objection made. It was moved by Klein and seconded by Shook that inasmuch as the owners of the property had signed their consent to the annexation of the territory, an ordinance be drawn for the annexation of the above mentioned property without election. Motion carried and so ordered.

Manager Burdick gave a summary of the condition of the City Streets and made proposals and recommendations for future improvements.

Manager Burdick gave the following report of the census for Milwaukie as he has prepared the same for the State Census Committee.
