Upon motion of Councilman Loeding seconded by Councilman Mitchell and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw an ordinance authorizing the issuance of improvement bonds to pay a portion of the cost of the improvement of Foster Road.
 Upon motion duly made and carried the Mayor and Recorder was instructed to enter into a contract, on behalf of the Town, with J. W. Morris to serve as City Engineer for the year 1914.
 Upon motion duly made and carried the Council adjourned subject to the call of the Mayor.

A call meeting of the one hundred forty second (142) regular meeting of the Town Council was held on the above named date. Meeting Called to order by Mayor Elmer. Present, Mayor Elmer, Councilmen, King, Loeding and Counsell, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Reed. A communication from the P. R. L. & P. Co. notifying the Council that the arc light ordered by the Town had been installed was read and order placed on file. Upon motion of Councilman Loeding seconded by councilman Counsell and carried, ordinance No. 99 entitled "An ordinance authorizing the issuance of improvement bonds in pursuance of an act of the Legislature of the State of Oregon, known as "The Bonding Act" as the same has been amended, and declaring an emergency, was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read the roll call showed the following results: Ayes, Councilmen King, Loeding and Counsell. Nays none. Absent Councilmen Mitchell and Albee. Ordinance No. 99 passed the first reading. Upon motion of Councilman Loeding seconded by councilman Counsell and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 99 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, Councilmen Loeding, Counsell, and King. Nays, none, Absent Councilmen Albee and Mitchell. Ordinance No. 99 passed the second reading.

Upon motion of councilman Counsell seconded by councilman Loeding and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 99 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following results: Ayes, councilmen, King, Loeding and Counsell. Nays, none. Absent, councilmen, Mitchell and Albee. Ordinance No. 99 passed the third and final reading.

The recorder was instructed to notify the P. R. L. & P. Co. to repair their eave spout on its building on Front Street.
