COUNCIL CHAMBERS, FEBRUARY 8, 1937

The four hundred thirty-sixth regular meeting of the Council was held on the 8th day of February, 1937.

The meeting was called to order by President of the Council Burdick. Present. Councilmen Burdick, Dell, Mourer, Roberts and Wills, Water Superintendent Bevington, Recorder Adams, and Fire Chief Lewellyn.

The minutes of the four hundred thirty-fourth and four hundred thirty-fifth regular meetings of the Council held respectively on the 11th and 25th days of January 1937 were each read and were each approved as read.

The Treasurer's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

The Fire Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

Ordinance Number 375 entitled " An Ordinance requiring each person, firm, or corporation applying to Milwaukee to have water turned on to serve any premises on and after March 1, 1937 to deposit three dollars (\$3.00) with the City Treasurer as security for payment of water bills accruing on account of water supplied to the particular premises, providing for the refund of said deposit and repealing conflicting ordinances and parts of ordinances." was taken up for the first time and read. Ordinance number 375 was read for the second and third times and put on its passage with the following result being had. Ayes: Burdick, Dell, Mourer, Roberts and Wills Noes: None. Ordinance 375 passed the Council.

Councilman Mourer reported on the Myrtle Street sewer assessment adjustment requested by L. S. Carter on his property and recommended that the request be denied. It was moved by Dell and seconded by Wills that the report of Councilman Mourer be adopted. Motion carried and so ordered.

James Roberts appeared before the Council in reference to the rental owed by him on the East Milwaukee Fire Hall premises. It was moved by Dell and seconded by Wills that consideration of the matter be postponed for two weeks. Motion carried and so ordered.

Recorder Adams requested authority to sell Lots 15 and 16, Block 11, Quincy Addition for the amounts owed the City on the same. It was moved by Dell and seconded by Wills that the Recorder be authorized to sell Lots 15 and 16, Block 11, Quincy Addition and all other lots owned by the City at a price per lot to be determined by the amount owed the City on the same. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Dell and seconded by Wills that the City pay the compensation of the substitute for the Water Superintendent for the two days the Water Superintendent was ill during January. Motion carried and so ordered. It was moved by Dell and seconded by Wills that the City purchase three cords of wood from W. H. Taylor. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Dell and seconded by Wills that the Recorder prepare and post an ordinance providing for a five year garbage collection franchise to Pacific Sanitary Service Company, the City to pay the Company seven dollars per month for the collection of cans and similar debris during the first year and \$25.00 per month for each year thereafter. Motion carried and so ordered.

The four hundred thirty-seventh meeting of the Council was held on the 22nd day of February, 1937.

Ordinance Number 376 was read for the second and third time and put on its passage with the following result being had Ayes, Burdick, Mourer, Roberts and Wills. Noes, none Ordinance Number 376 passed the Council.

James Roberts appeared before the Council and requested additional time within which to pay his arrearages in rent on the East Milwaukie Fire Hall premises. It was moved by Wills and seconded by Roberts that Mr. Roberts be given until April 1st to pay the rental arrearages owed by him. Motion carried and so ordered.

Water Superintendent Bevington reported that the State Highway Commission
