

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, FEBRUARY 11th. 1913.

The one hundred thirty-first (131) regular meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Elmer. Present, Mayor Elmer, Councilmen Davis, King, Counsell and Mitchell, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Davis.

The minutes of the one hundred thirtieth (130) regular meeting held on the 14th day of January, 1913, and of the adjourned meeting of the one hundred thirtieth (130) regular meeting held on the 17th. day of January, 1913, also the minutes of the special meeting held on the 30th day of January, 1913, were read and approved as read.

The following bills were allowed and upon motion of Councilman Counsell seconded by councilman Mithchell and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants in payment fo the same;

Councilman Mitchell reported, that upon investigation, he found The bills of Giltner & Sewall for \$80.00 and the bill of Herman Loading for \$22.50 correct, and upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman King and carried, the said bills were ordered paid. The bid of J. E. Wetzler of \$250.00 for a ten foot tract of land lying on the north side of Washington street between Main and Front streets was read as was also the bid of N. E. Moffitt of \$249.00 for the same land, and upon motion of Councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman King and carried, the bid of Mr. Wetzler was accepted and the Mayor and Recorder was instructed to execute acQuitClaim deed, on behalf of the Town of Milwaukie, to J. E. Wetzler, conveying to him the property above described. The communication of the P. R. L. & P. Company in regard to the arc lights installed was read and referred to the light committee by Mayor Elmer. The license Committee reported that they had notified the owner of the Milwaukie Tavern to make application to the Council to have A. J. Burne liquor license transferred, and that they had notified U. S. Germanetti to file a bond with the Recorder. The application of Mr. Thompson for the transfer of Robby Evan's pool license was taken up and upon motion of Councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman King and carried, the recorder was instructed to transfer the pool license of Mr, Evans to Mr, Thompson.

The adjourned meeting of the one hundred thirty-first (131) regular
 meeting of the Town council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the
 above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Elmer. Present,
 Mayor Elmer, Councilmen, Mitchell, Davis, Counsell and King, Recorder
 Mathews and Marshal Davis. The application for the transfer of the
 liquor license of A. J. Burns to Earl Alphin was read and upon motion of
 of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman King and Carried the
 Recorder was instructed to transfer the said licenses to Earl Alphin.

Upon motion of Councilman King seconded by councilman Mitchell and
 carried, the following bills were allowed and the Recorder was instructed
 to draw warrants on the general fund for the payment of the same:

The Recorder was instructed to notify the P. R. L. & P. Co., to
 move the arc lights at Front and Jefferson Streets and at Front and
 Jackson streets farther over Front street.

Upon motion of Councilman Mitchell seconded by Councilman King and
 carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw up an ordinance making it
 a misdemeanor for any person or persons to own or keep a dog within
 the corporate limits of the Town of Milwaukie without first obtaining
 a license therefor, said ordinance to conform with the Portland
