

The four hundred eighty-second regular meeting of the Council was held on the 13th day of February, 1939.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Burdick.

Present: Mayor Burdick, Councilmen Gillem, Mourer, Roberts and Rudder, Water Superintendent Bevington, Marshal Stanley, Fire Chief Lewellyn and Recorder Adams.

The minutes of the four hundred eightieth and four hundred eight-first regular meetings of the Council held respectively on the 9th and 23rd days of January, 1939 were each read and were each approved as read.

The Treasurers monthly report was read and ordered filed.

The Fire Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

Mourer nominated Roberts for the presidency of the City Council. The nomination was seconded by Rudder. It was moved by Mourer and seconded by Rudder that the nominations be closed and that Roberts be elected President of the Council by acclamation. Motion carried and so ordered.
