TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, FEBRUARY 18TH, 1913.

The adjourned meeting of the one hundred thirty-first (131) regular  
 meeting of the Town council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the  
 above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Elmer. Present,  
 Mayor Elmer, Councilmen, Mitchell, Davis, Counsell and King, Recorder  
 Mathews and Marshal Davis. The application for the transfer of the  
 liquor license of A. J. Burns to Earl Alphin was read and upon motion of  
 of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman King and Carried the  
 Recorder was instructed to transfer the said licenses to Earl Alphin.

Upon motion of Councilman King seconded by councilman Mitchell and  
 carried, the following bills were allowed and the Recorder was instructed  
 to draw warrants on the general fund for the payment of the same:

- P. R. L. & P. Co., for lighting.....\$93.33
- C. B. Davis, for salary, labor and posting notices.. \$40.90.
- J. E. Wetzler, for refund ..... \$78.83.
- T. W. Hart for piping, rpairing lavatory, and putting  
 a fire hydrant.....\$13.90.

Oregon Printing Company for printing five proposed  
 amendments to City Charter (500 copies) and 500 letter  
 heads and 500 envelopes..... \$46.75.

The Recorder was instructed to notify the P. R. L. & P. Co., to  
 move the arc lights at Front and Jefferson Streets and at Front and  
 Jackson streets farther over Front street.

Upon motion of Councilman Mitchell seconded by Councilman King and  
 carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw up an ordinance making it  
 a misdemeanor for any person or persons to own or keep a dog within  
 the corporate limits of the Town of Milwaukie without first obtaining  
 a license therefor, said ordinance to conform with the Portland

ordinance regulating the running at large of dogs.

Upon motion of Councilman Davis seconded by councilman Mitchell and carried, the Recorder was instructed to advertise for sale all the street improvement bonds uncolld.

Upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman King and carried, the Recorder was instructed to notify the Southern Pacific Company that unless the over-head crossing over Foster Road was not put in and completed within thirty days, the Council would declare the crossing in its present condition a nuisance and order the Marshal to take a force of men and remove the obstruction from the street.

The following persons were appointed to act as judges and Clerks of the special election to be held on the 18th day of March, 1913: Judges, F. C. Harlow, William Shindler and Samuel Riley. Clerks, Ray Albee and G. C. Pelton.

The following resolution was read and upon motion of councilman King seconded by councilman Davis and Carried was adopted as Read:

*Resolution NO. 4 - 1913*

RESOLVED by the Town Council of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, that the old deserted and unoccupied powder magazine, generally supposed to belong to Mr. N. B. Harvey on the Southern Pacific Railroad in the Eastern portion of the Town of Milwaukie, are a menace to the public peace, safety and health of the people of said Town of Milwaukie, inasmuch as they have become the abode of tramps and hoboes, who imperil the lives and safety of the people living in the vicinity; and said deserted and unoccupied powder houses are hereby declared a nuisance, and the Marshal of said Town of Milwaukie is instructed to notify Mr. Harvey of the action of this council, and to further notify Mr. Harvey to tear down and remove said deserted and unoccupied powder houses at once.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that in case Mr. Harvey refuses or neglects to so tear down or remove said nuisance, the Marshal is instructed to proceed to so tear down and remove said nuisance at the expense of said N. B. Harvey.

RESOLVED FURTHER, that this Resolution only applies to those houses that are open and unsealed and can be used for the abode of tramps and hoboes.

No further business coming before the meeting upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Davis and carried, the council adjourned.
