

TOWN HALL MILWAUKIE, OREGON, FEB. 18TH. 1922.

The two hundred thirty-ninth (239) regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, was held on the 18th day of February, 1922. Present, Mayor Snyder, Councilmen, Miller, Shindler, Counsell and Hart, Recorder Mathews, Marshal Keck, and Treasurer Streib. Meeting called to order by Mayor Snyder. The minutes of the 238th regular meeting of the Council held on the 3rd day of January, 1922, and the minutes of the special meeting held on the 31st day of January, 1922, were read and approved as read. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council canvassed the votes cast at the special election held on the 16th day of February, 1922, which canvas showed the following results:

The Water Committee reported that it had interviewed Commissioner Mann of the City of Portland in regard to a reduction of water rates but were unable to get any reduction in water rates. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Mayor and Recorder were instructed to enter into a contract on the behalf of the Town of Milwaukie with the City of Portland for furnishing water to Milwaukie.

A petition requesting the Council to install an arc light at 30th and Sellwood Streets was read and referred to the Light Committee.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Mayor and Recorder were instructed to draw several warrants in lieu of the warrant drawn for the payment of the improvement of 32nd. Street.
