COUNCIL CHAMBERS, FEBRUARY 22, 1937

The four hundred thirty-seventh meeting of the Council was held on the 22nd day of February, 1937.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sanders Present: Mayor Sanders, Councilman Burdick, Mourer, Roberts, and Wills; Water Superintendent Bevington, Marsnall Elsing, Fire Chief Lewellyn and Recorder Adams.

Ordinance Number 376 entitled " An Ordinance granting a five year franchise to collect garbage to Pacific Sanitary Service Co." was taken up for the first time and read. Ordinance Number 376 was read for the second and third time and put on its passage with the following result being had Ayes, Burdick, Mourer, Roberts and Wills. Noes, none Ordinance Number 376 passed the Council.

James Roberts appeared before the Council and requested additional time within which to pay his arrearages in rent on the East Milwaukie Fire Hall premises. It was moved by Wills and seconded by Roberts that Mr Roberts be given until April 1st to pay the rental arrearages owed by him Motion carried and so ordered.

Water Superintendent Bevington reported that the State Highway Commission

desired water for the beautification work along th Super-highway in Milwaukee. It was moved by Burdick and seconded by Wills that the Water Superintendent install water services for the beautification work and that the Highway Commission be billed for the same. Motion carried and so ordered.

Mr. Bevington requested authority to purchase six yards of gravel for street repair purposes and five water meters and twelve cement meter boxes. It was moved by Roberts and seconded by Burdick that Mr. Bevington be authorized to make the purchases requested. Motion carried and so ordered.

S. L. Burton asked that the City consider re-naming the section of street from thirtieth to thirty-second streets from Elmer to WashingtonStreets It was moved by Mourer and seconded by Wills that action on the request be deferred pending an investigation. Motion carried and so ordered.

Upon motion duly made and carried the meeting adjourned.

COUNCIL CHAMBERS, MARCH 8, 1937

The four hundred thirty-eighth regular meeting of the Council was held on the eighth day of March, 1937 in the Council Chambers.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sanders, Present: Mayor Sanders Councilmen Burdick, Dell, Mourer, Roberts and Wills, Water Superintendent Bevington, Marshal Elsing, Fire Chief Lewellyn and Recorder Adams.

The minutes of the four hundred thirty-sixth and four hundred thirty-seventh regular meetings of the Council held respectively on the 8th and 22nd days of February, 1937, were each read and were each approved as read.

The Treasurer's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

The Fire Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

Councilman Burdick reported on the condition of the City Streets and recommended that the County road-grader be secured for a three day period to go over the streets. It was moved by Dell and seconded by Burdick that the City hire the County road-grader for a three day period to go over the City Streets. Motion carried and so ordered.

Councilman Dell reported on the street lighting and recommended the relocating of street lights at 25th and Monroe Streets to a pole two hundred feet further east and also the relocating of the light at the intersection of Railroad Avenue and Harrison Street. After some discussion Councilman Dell stated that he would secure figures on the cost of relocating the lights in question.

It was moved by Roberts and seconded by Dell that the Recorder prepare and post an ordinance providing for the increase of minimum water allowance, reducing the rate on the excess over the minimum from 12¢ to 5¢ per hundred cubic feet to users located within the City and from 22¢ to 10¢ per hundred cubic feet to users located without the City during the two months periods of July-August and September-October of each year. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Dell and seconded by Wills that E. A. Stanley be employed on a month to month basis as traffic officer, effective March 15, 1937, at a salary of \$100 per month. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Burdick and seconded by Dell that the City Engineer prepare specifications for a booster pump for the Water Department and that the Water Superintendent and Recorder advise pump manufacturers of such specifications and invite them to bid on supplying a pump. Such bids to be opened at the regular meeting March 22, 1937. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Burdick and seconded by Wills that the City do not favorably endorse any more beer license applications. Motion carried and so ordered.
