


The petition for the improvement on Washington Street was postponed until the next meeting.

TOWN HALL MILWAUKIE, OREGON MARCH 2, 1911.

The Council of Milwaukie met on the above date pursuant to adjournment of meeting of Feb. 15, 1911. Rolled called showed the following officers present: Mayor, Philip Streib; Recorder W.A. Hansen; Marshal Davis; Councilman J.R.Kelso, Warren Knight, W.F.Lehman, and Chas. T. Stockton.

A petition containing 116 names filed by A.C.Ulrich for certain amendments to Ordinance Number 49 and also a letter were read and after some discussion of same upon motion by Lehman and 2nd by ^{Stockton} ~~Streib~~, it was ordered that Ordinance stand as posted.

Rolled called showed the vote to be as follows: Aye, Knight, Kelso, Lehman and Stockton. Nays none. So the amendments were defeated.

Ordinance Number 49 was then taken up for passage, read and on motion received the unanimous vote of the Council and was duly declared adopted. The plans and specifications for estimates of the work to be done at the cost thereof, for the improvement of Main Street, according to petitions, therefore were submitted by the City Engineer and exhibited to the Council and upon motion the following resolution was read and adopted by the council and ordered posted as required by the City Charter:

RESOLUTION AND NOTICE FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF MAIN STREET
MILWAUKEE, OREGON.

WHEREAS, pursuant to an order of the city council of Milwaukee, Oregon, heretofore made, the city engineer has filed his report and filled in the office of the recorder of said Milwaukee, plans and specifications, for an improvement, together with the estimate, of the work to be done and the cost thereof, and, whereas, such plans and specifications and estimates are satisfactory to the council of said Milwaukee, therefore, the plans, specifications, and estimates are hereby approved, and be it RESOLVED, that it is the purpose and intention of Milwaukee by its City Council to make the said improvements, being described as follows to wit:

The Street shall be brought to sub-grade the full width thereof between the curbs. On the road bed macadam shall be placed not less than ~~four~~ ^{four} inches thick at the curb and not less than ~~four~~ ^{four} inches thick at the center of the Street, and when completed the said Street shall be brought to the established grade.

Said street shall be properly provided with all drains, catch Basins and Gutters necessary to preserve the grades, curbs and surface of the street, and to provide all proper drainage. Cross Walks shall be made as provided in the plans and specifications and the whole street shall be completed according to the plans and specifications filed herein and approved by this resolution.

The City Recorder is hereby directed to cause this resolution and notice to be posted as required by the City Charter of Milwaukee.

The foregoing resolution was adopted by the Council of Milwaukee at a ~~public~~ meeting held on the ~~2nd~~ day of ~~March~~ 1911.


