

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, FEB. 3RD. 1920.

The two hundred fifteenth regular meeting of the Council was held on the 3rd day of February, 1920. Mayor Snyder being absent J. J. Miller, Pres. of the Council, called the meeting to order. Present, Councilmen, Miller, Grasle, Hart, Albee and Counsell, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Reed. The minutes of the two hundred and fourteenth regular meetings of the Council held on the 6th day of January, 1920, and the minutes of the special meeting of the Council held on the 26th day of January, 1920, were read and approved as read. Mr. Counsell reported that he had put 37 loads of gravel on the Streets, and that the streets were now in a condition to grade and if the weather kept good he would run the grader over them. The Recorder was instructed to notify the P. R. L. & P. Co. to repair its railroad crossing near Island Station on Milwaukie Highway at the south limits of the Town. The Recorder was also instructed to notify the Portland Gas & Coke Company to repair its crossings on Harrison and Washington Streets. The report of the State Fire Marshal was read and referred to the Fire Commission. Upon motion duly made and carried the Recorder was instructed to prepare an ordinance regulating the storage of gasoline and explosives in the Town of Milwaukie and repealing Ordinance No. 1.

Upon motion duly made and carried the recorder was instructed to look up the records and ascertain the amount of money the City had paid out for police protection for the Milwaukie Boxing Arena and send the bill to the Milwaukie Boxing Commission.

The following bills were read and allowed by the Finance Committee and upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants on the Treasurer for the payment of the same:

TOWN HALL MILWAUKIE, OREGON, MARCH 2, 1920.

The two hundred sixteenth (216) regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the 2nd day of March, 1920.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Snyder. Present, Mayor Snyder, councilmen, Miller, Grasle, Albee, Counsell and Hart, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Reed. The minutes of the two hundred fifteenth regular meeting of the Council held on the 3rd day of February, 1920, were read and approved as read. Upon motion of councilman Albee duly made and carried, the bill of \$100.00 sent to the Milwaukie Boxing Commission was withdrawn. The Water Committee reported that the stand-pipe at the intersection of 37th & Eddy Street was out of order and needed repairing, also the one at the end of Monroe Street. The Water Supt. was instructed to make the necessary repairs.

The Street Committee reported that the foot bridge at the end of Washington Street had been repaired, also that the bridge in front of Mr. Harlow's place needed repairing. The matter was referred to the Street Committee to make a report on later. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Mayor was instructed to interview the County Court and see if the County would do some paving for the Town. A petition to extend Harrison Street from 34th to 37th Street was read and the Recorder was instructed to prepare the necessary resolution for the extending the same. Mr. Sellwood was present and requested the Council to vacate the east end of Elmer Street. The matter was referred to the Street Committee and City Engineer.

A petition requesting the Council to install an arc light at the intersection of 24th and Lewelling Streets was read and the

Recorder was instructed to notify the P. R. L. & P. Co to install the light as petitioned for. The report of the Fire Commissioners was read and upon motion duly made and carried, the Fire Dept. was authorized to purchase the material recommended by the Fire Commissioners. Some of the people East of Town were present and ask the Council to furnish them with Bull Run Water. Moved and seconded that the Town of Milwaukie furnish the residents east of Town with Bull Run water upon the same terms and conditions that the Town furnishes the Lakewood Mutual Water Users Association with water.

Motion carried. The Water Supt. was instructed to notify the water users outside of the city limits that the rate for water is \$2.00 per month minimum, and to send all the users who have been paying \$1.50 per month a bill for the difference of \$.50 per month. The Water Supt. was instructed to extend a 1 inch water main from 46th & Jefferson Streets to 40th & Adams Streets, thence west on Adams Street about 200 feet. Ordinance No. 163, regulating the Storage of gasoline and explosives was read and the Recorder was instructed to post a copy of the same as required by the City Charter.

The following bills were read and allowed by the Finance Committee and upon motion duly made and carried, the recorder was instructed to draw warrants in payment of the same:

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, MARCH 11, 1920.

A special meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Snyder. Present, Mayor Snyder, Councilmen, Grasle, Miller, Albee, Hart and Counsell, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Reed. Mr. Mullan representing the Wichita Mutual Water Company was present and made application for bull run water for the Company. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Water Supt. was instructed to extend a 3 inch water main to the City limits at 42nd and King Streets to connect with the Wichita Mutual Water Company's main. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to prepare a contract between the Town of Milwaukie and the Wichita Mutual Water Company.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Mayor and Recorder were instructed to execute the contract on behalf of the Town with the Wichita Mutual Water Company for furnishing the Company with Bull Run water. Mayor Snyder stated that he had seen the County Judge in regard to paving some of the Streets in Milwaukie and that the County would do the paving for the Town at cost. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Mayor was instructed to employ an Engineer to do the necessary surveying for the proposed extension of Harrison Street. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned.
