

## MEETING OF FEBRUARY 22, 1943.

COUNCIL CHAMBER

575th COUNCIL

The five hundred seventy-fifth regular meeting of the Council was held on the twenty-second day of February 1943.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Roberts.

Present: Mayor Roberts, Councilmen Newman, Bevington, and Sperr, Fire Chief Lewellyn, and Recorder Martin. Absent: Councilmen McClure and Rowe, Treasurer Farrington, Attorney Adams, and Water Superintendant Counsell.

The minutes of the five hundred seventy-fourth regular meeting of the Council held on the eighth day of February 1943 were read and approved as read.

The Recorder was directed to write a letter to the School Board of School District No. 1 regarding the overflow of water from Spring Creek, on their sidewalk along Harrison street.

The Mayor read letters from the following State Legislators with regard to Housebills 213 and 216. H.H.Chindgren, Dean Bryson, and Howard Belton.

The Mayor stated that he had found a man with police experience who would do part time police work for the City and recommended Mr. Glen Shockley to work from 5 P.M. until 1:30 A.M. and be subject to call at all times, at \$75.00 per month; it being understood that the City furnish the gasoline for the police car. It was moved by Bevington and seconded by Sperr that the Mayor be empowered to employ Glen Shockley, or anyone he finds fit, as City Police officer at \$75.00 per month for part time work. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Bevington and seconded by Sperr, that the City sell to William J. and Florence M. Bigham, Lot 12 Block 1. Brownell's Acres, and the Tract of land described in Deed recorded in Vol. 138 Page 581 Record of Deeds for Clackamas County, Oregon for the sum of \$309.76, and that the City redeem from the County Lot 12 Block 1 Brownell's Acres for \$8.88, for Mr. Bigham, at his expense. Motion carried and so ordered.

Mr. Iver Tolstead came before the Council and offered to purchase the store house on Railroad Ave. for \$400.00. After some discussion it was decided that since it would be impossible to get materials to build another warehouse, it would be unwise to sell.

It was moved by Bevington and seconded by Newman that the following bills be allowed and that the Recorder be directed to issue warrants for the payment of same.

## MEETING OF MARCH 8, 1943.

The five hundred seventy-sixth regular meeting of the Council was held on the eighth day of March 1943.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Roberts.

Present: Mayor Roberts; Councilmen Newman, Bevington, Sperr, and Rowe; Treasurer Farrington, Attorney Adams, Fire Chief Lewellyn, and Recorder Martin. Absent: Councilman McClure, Water Superintendant Counsell and Officer Shockley.

The minutes of the five hundred seventy-fifth regular meeting of the Council, held on the twenty-second day of February 1943, were read and approved as read.

It was moved by Sperr and seconded by Bevington that the insurance on the Street and Water department trucks be renewed with Harry Dean. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 436, AN ORDINANCE granting one year franchise to collect garbage to the Milwaukie Sanitary Service, was read for the first time. Ordinance Number 436 was read the second and third times by title only with the consent of the Council and put on its passage with the following results being had: Ayes: Newman, Bevington, Sperr and Rowe Nays: None. Ordinance Number 436 passed the

Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

The Recorder notified the Council that the Fuel Oil Contract was expired and was directed to call for bids for a new contract.

The Mayor presented Civilian Defense Cards and Arm Bands to twenty-two members of the Disaster Enrollment Committee stationed at five shelter bases in Milwaukie.

Mr. A.C. Wherry, representing the Kiwanas Club, came before the Council and stated that the Club was planning a Military Honor Roll on which would be placed the names of all men and women who had resided in Milwaukie and vicinity who had entered the armed services. Mr. Wherry asked permission to have this Honor Roll painted on the entrance wall of the City Hall. It was moved by Rowe and seconded by Newman that the Kiwanas Club be permitted to place this Honor Roll on the entrance wall of the City Hall. Motion carried and so ordered.

Mr. C.S. Hahn came before the Council and asked permission to haul long piling north on Main street to Jefferson street and west on Jefferson street to the river. Mr. Hahn asked that Main and Jefferson streets be cleared of parked cars for a distance of 100 feet from the intersection of these streets in order that the corner may be turned by the truck. It was moved by Rowe and seconded by Bevington that the matter be left with Mr. Sperr to work out satisfactorily with Mr. Hahn. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Auditor's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

The Fire Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

It was moved by Sperr and seconded by Rowe that the Fire Chief be furnished with relief once each week at \$8.00 per day beginning Feb. 1, 1943, and if the Chief is unable to get a relief man, that he shall be paid for serving. Motion carried and so ordered.

Mr. Bevington brought before the Council the matter of raising the salary of the Water Superintendent. It was agreed that Mr. Bevington talk the matter over with Mr. Counsell and recommend to the Council, at its next meeting, the amount of salary agreed upon.

It was moved by Sperr and seconded by Bevington that the City purchase a siren to be used on the police car. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Rowe and seconded by Sperr that the following bills be allowed and that the Recorder be directed to issue warrants for the payment of same.
