

TOWN HALL MILWAUKIE, OREGON, MARCH 10TH 1914.

The one hundred forty-fourth (144) regular meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by presiding Councilman Mitchell. Present, councilmen, Mitchell, Loeding, King, Counsell and Albee, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Reed. The minutes of the meetings of the Council held on the 10th and 24th days of February, 1914, and on the 9th day of March, 1914, were read and approved as read.

The following bills were read and approved by the Finance Committee, and upon motion of councilman King seconded by councilman Loeding and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants on the several funds in payment of the same:

- P. R. L. & P. Co. for lighting for Feb. 1914,... \$124.70
- P. R. L. & P. Co. for lighting fire house. 2.65.
- P. D. Cunningham & Co for 100 dog tags 3.00
- A. L. Reed salary.. 45.00
- Keystone Press for printing 300 bonds..... 72.00
- Herman Loeding for electric lamps for City Hall.... 8.05
- D. P. Mathews for salary & stamps for City..... 26.00
- C. R. Rattin, graveling and repairing Foster Road.. 53.35
- Montague-O'Reilly Co. for work on Front Street (6th monthly estimate)..... \$1310.24
- J. W. Morris, engineering services on Front Street 777.72

A communication from the Montague-O'Reilly Co. in regard to paying the extra engineering expenses caused by their delay in the completion of Front Street was read and ordered placed on file. A petition of the property owners along Laurel Avenue for the improvement thereof was read and the Council deeming it expedient that said street be improved as prayed for in the petition, upon motion of Councilman Loeding seconded by councilman Albee and carried, the City Engineer was instructed to make plans and specifications for said improvement, and estimates of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof..

A communication from the Milwaukie Commercial Club requesting the Council to appoint a committee to act with a like Committee from the Commercial Club to devise mean for an amendment to the Charter, and to ascertain if an amendment could be voted upon at the Primary election to be held on May 15th 1914, was read and upon motion, duly made and carried the following persons were appointed as such Committee: Albee, King and Loeding.

The petition of J. A. Keck for a family liquor license was read and referred to the License Committee and City Attorney.. Mr. Grable and others stated that they had heard that the parties operating the Milwaukie Tavern were violating the law. The matter was referred to the License Committee for investigation..

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned subject to the call of the Mayor.

TOWN HALL MILWAUKIE, OREGON, MARCH 23RD. 1914.

A call meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Flmer. Present, Mayor Flmer, councilmen, King, Loeding, Counsell and Mitchell, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Reed.

The Mayor stated that the meeting was called for the purpose of hearing the report of the License Committee. Mr Counsell Chairman of the Committee stated that the Committee was not ready to make a report. at this time. Mr. Loeding stated that Mr. Morris had consented to devise a system for renaming and numbering the streets of Milwaukie. Upon motion of councilman Counsell seconded by councilman Loeding and carried, the Marshal was instructed to swear out warrants for the arrest of every dog owner who has failed to pay the dog license. The matter of the improvement of Monroe street was referred to the Street Committee. Councilman Loeding of the Committee appointed to investigate the Milwaukie Tavern reported that he had made an investigation and so far as he could ascertain the Tavern was being run according to the law.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw an amendment to Ordinance No. 98, providing for a license of \$400.00 from persons selling liquor in original packages or bottles. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to notify the Fonnelt estate to remove the Old Mill Building from Harrison Street immediately.. The agreement of Mr. Gratton agreeing to certain changes in the plans and specifications for the improvement of Front Street was read and accepted, and upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to Notify the Montague-O'Reilly Company of the same. Upon motion duly made and carried the Council adjourned.
