Meeting called to order by Mayor Elmer. Present, Mayor Elmer, Councilmen King, Davis, Mitchell and Counsell, Recorder Mathews, Treasurer Bolstad and Marshal Davis. The minutes of the one hundred thirty-first regular meeting of the Council held on the 11th. day of February, 1913, and also the minutes of the adjourned meeting of the regular one hundred thirty first (131) meeting held on the 18th, day of February, 1913, were read and approved as read. The following bills were read and allowed and upon motion of Councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Davis and carried, the recorder was instructed to draw warrant on the general fund in payment of the same;

Mr. Burns of the Southern Pacific Company stated that the Company would be unable to get the material for the over-head crossing for Foster Road until some time in April, but as soon as the material arrived the Company would rush the work on the crossing until it was completed.

The petition of the property owners on Euclid Avenue for the vacation of said avenue was read, and upon motion of Councilman King seconded by councilman Counsell and carried the petition was laid on the table.

The petition for the improvement of Front Street was read and upon Motion of Councilman Mitchell duly seconded and carried, the petition was accepted and ordered filed. A petition for the improvement of Monroe Street was read and upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Davis and carried, the said petition was referred to the street committee. The application of Mr. Thompson for a pool-room license was read and upon motion duly seconded and carried, the application was granted and the recorder was instructed to issue to Mr.

Thompson, upon the payment of the license fee, a license to conduct a pool-room within Milwaukie for a period of three months.

Ordinance No. 83 entitled: " An Ordinance regulating the running at large of dogs both male and female within the corporate limits of the Town of Milwaukie and providing for the licensing thereof; providing a penalty for the violation of the provisions of this ordinance and repealing Ordinance No. 30," was read and upon motion of Councilman Davis seconded by councilman Mitchell and carried, the ordinance was ordered posted. Upon motion of Council man King seconded by councilman Davis and carried, the Treasurer was instructed to pay W. H. Counsell the sum of \$450.00 out of the Milwaukie and Sandy Road street improvement fund , the same to apply to-ward the payment of a warrant held by Mr. Counsell against the said improvement fund,

Upon motion of Councilman Mitchell duly seconded and carried the meeting adjourned until 7:30 P. M. March 20th. 1913.

Elmer and Recorder Mathews were appointed as a committee to attend said hearing, at the expense of the Town, to represent the City of Milwaukie at the hearing, and in the event that the wayer and Recorder is unable to attend the hearing, then the Mayor is authorized to appoint some person or persons in their place.
