

MEETING OF MARCH 11, 1946

COUNCIL CHAMBER

648th MEETING

The six hundred forty-eighth regular meeting of the Council was held on the eleventh day of March 1946.

The Meeting was called to order by Mayor Sperr.

Present: Mayor Sperr, Councilmen; Hamlin and Nelson Manager Kelsey, Auditor Phillips, Water Superintendant Hofmann, Officer Burbank and Recorder Martin.

The minutes of the six hundred forty-seventh regular meeting of the Council held on the twenty-fifth day of February, 1946, were read and approved as read.

It was moved by Nelson and seconded by Hamlin that L.B. Mullan be permitted to build a "drive in" to his garage on Jackson Street, this "drive in" to be put in under the specifications and supervision of City Manager Kelsey. Motion carried and so ordered.

A letter from Ralph E. Klein, protesting the sea-plane base in Milwaukie, was read. It was moved by Nelson and seconded by Hamlin that the letter be tabled. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Hamlin and seconded by Nelson that the City join with the County in the purchase of Motor Vehicle Registration Lists, from the Secretary of State, for use in the Municipal Court and Justice of Peace Court. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Nelson and seconded by Hamlin that the City accept a contract with Richfield Oil Corp. to furnish the City with gasoline at the following prices:

Richfield Ethyl..... . . . . \$0.1775 \$0.1395

Hi-Octane (first grade non-premium).. \$0.1395

Motion carried and so ordered.

Messrs. Murphy and Snyder of the East Side Bus Company and Mr. Wendt, attorney for the East Side Bus Company appeared before the Council and made protest against Ordinance No. 471. There was considerable discussion on the matter, during which suggestions were made on ways to route the buses so as to eliminate the traffic congestion on Monroe Street. It was moved by Nelson and seconded by Hamlin that the matter be referred to Manager Kelsey to work out with the Bus Company a plan for providing a parking area with shelter, on Jackson Street between Main Street and Front Street, and a franchise for the Buses. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Hamlin and seconded by Nelson that the following resolution be adopted, accepting the Federal Works Agency Agreement No. Ore. 35-P-19 and that the Mayor and Recorder be directed to sign said agreement. *Resolution 3-1946*

WHEREAS: The City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon, has applied to Federal Works Agency Bureau of Community Facilities, for funds for Advance Planning of Non Federal Public Works, and said Bureau has informed said City that it is prepared to enter into an agreement with said City to advance the said City the sum of \$4,355.00

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED: that the Mayor and Recorder of the City of Milwaukie be and they hereby are authorized to execute, in behalf of said City, the agreement submitted by said Bureau.

Motion carried and so ordered.

Mr. Kelsey laid before the Council the matter of depreciation of certain of the pipe lines through which certain of the outside water users were being supplied with water. Mr. Kelsey pointed out that these lines were small pipe and should be replaced with regular mains which would be expensive. It was decided that Mr. Kelsey make investigation and ascertain where the adjacent water district boundary lines were before pipe lines were replaced.

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Mr. Kelsey informed the Council that due to labor strikes, the Pump, Pipe and Power Company had been unable to get a motor for the pump they were to install in the new well. It was decided that Mr. Kelsey be authorized to work with the Pump, Pipe and Power Co. to get a motor, either used or new, for the pump.

Ordinance Number 473, AN ORDINANCE to amend Ordinance No. 4700 by amending sections 10 and 18 thereof: and thereby modifying the restriction thereby imposed on the amount of the assessment that may be imposed on any parcel of land benefitted by the proposed improvement, was taken up for its second reading and put on its passage with the following result being had. Ayes: Sperr, Nelson and Hamlin, Nays: None. Ordinance Number 473 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Ordinance Number 474 AN ORDINANCE to forbid parking on the west side of 21st Street between Monroe and Jefferson Streets, and providing a penalty for the violation thereof, was taken up for its second reading and put on its passage with the following results being had. Ayes: Sperr, Hamlin and Nelson. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 474 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

The Fire Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

It was moved by Nelson and seconded by Hamlin that the Mayor appoint a committee of five to make investigation of traffic conditions throughout the City and make recommendation to the Council as to which intersections should have "STOP" signs posted. Motion carried and so ordered. The Mayor appointed the following committee: H.A.Nelson, Chairman; L.D.Kelsey, H.A.Burbank, Wm.R.Hofmann, and H.M.Ray.

It was moved by Nelson and seconded by Hamlin that the following bills be allowed and that the Recorder be directed to issue warrants for the payment of same.

MEETING OF MARCH 25, 1946

COUNCIL CHAMBER

649th MEETING

The six hundred forty-ninth regular meeting of the Council was held on the twenty-fifth day of March 1946.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sperr.

Present: Mayor Sperr, Councilmen Hamlin, Nelson, Roberts and Rowe; Manager Kelsey, Auditor Phillips, Water Superintendent Hofmann, Officer Burbank and Recorder Martin.

The minutes of the six hundred forty-eighth regular meeting of the Council, held on the eleventh day of March 1946, were read and approved as read.

Mr. A.Y. Alcorn, of the Southern Pacific Co. came before the Council and made inquiry as to the prospects of sewers and water supply being available for the industrial area in Kellogg Park. Mr. Alcorn stated that if these facilities were available he could place industries in this area which would be of great benefit to Milwaukie. The Mayor stated that there was to be a meeting of some of the zoning committee and Clackamas County Housing Authority representatives on Tuesday, March 26, and assured Mr. Alcorn that this matter would be taken up for consideration at this meeting.

Mr. Winkle, of the Pump, Pipe and Power Co. came before the Council and stated that the labor strikes in the east had delayed delivery of the Worthington Pump for the new well, but that he had received a telegram stating that the pump only would be shipped in a few days and that if the motor for this pump does not reach here by June 1, 1946 that his Company had another motor available which they would install. Mr. Winkle stated that Pump, Pipe & Power Co. would guarantee to have the pump installed and in running order by June 1.

Mr. Theo. Witt, speaking for Leonard Mullan, made application to have the grade set for curb on the west side of 28th Street south of Monroe Street. Mr. Kelsey pointed out that the City had no Transit with which to do engineering work, and that there would be much need of one in the near future.
