The ordinance having passed the 2nd reading moved by Councilman Knight seconded by Councilman Stockton that Ordinance No. 69 be taken up for 3rd reading and final passage. The ordinance having been read, roll called showed the following result, Ayes Councilmen Stockton, Lehman and Knight, nays none. *Ordinance passed.*

Next proposition was discussion of possibility of improvement of Foster Road. Knight stating that Kelsy had agreed to come out and survey and stake out the road and establish the center of the road and give the property owners a chance to compromise among themselves as to its final location. It was moved by Councilman Lehman seconded by Councilman Stockton that Councilman Knight be authorized to engage Eng. Kelsy to establish the lines for Foster Road at the expense of the property owners on said road. Carried.
