

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, MARCH 14, 1911.

The 108 regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was called to order by Mayor Streib, roll called showed the following officers present: Philip Streib, Mayor, W.A.Hansen Recorder, Davis Marshall, Councilmen, Warren Knight, J.R.Kelso, W.F.Lehman, Chas. T.Stockton. Council Kelso reported that the P.R.L. & P.Co. would install the light as required by the Council.

The Committee to whom was refered the Mt Hood power Co. franchise reported that they had made the necessary changes and the Recorder was instructed to post the ordinance containing.

The water report postponed from the last meeting was read and 107 faucets were reported in use and on motion the report was ordered filed.

Mrs. Albee asked the City Council to make out a bill covering breakage by the Boy's Club, she also asked that the Council appoint one member of the Council or officer of the City to be placed in charge of the Hall and have authority to control the same, on motion Mayor Streib was appointed and he accepted the appointment with the provision that he be allowed to name some one to act in his stead when he was absent.

Mrs. E.V.Sellwood brought to the attention of the Council a dispute regarding Patton Avenue, and was refered to the Street Committee for further investigation.

A petition for the improvement of Harrison Street was read and ordered filed and upon motion the City Engineer was instructed to furnish plans and specifications for an appropriate improvement of said street in accordance with the petition together with estimates of the work to be done and the cost thereof, and that the report be ready for the next meeting of the City Council.

A petition signed by property owners on Scott Street asking for the street to be opened, and have a drinking fountain to be placed at the north end of Main Street was refered to the Street Committee for further consideration.

The City Engineer furnished plans and specifications for the improvement of Washington Street and estimates of the work to be done and the cost thereof, which plans, specifications and estimates were exhibited to the Council, whereupon the Council adopted the following resolution and ordered it to be posted as required by the Charter:

Resolution and notice for the improvement of Washington Street
Milwaukie Ore.

Whereas, pursuant to an order of the city Council of Milwaukie Oregon
here to fore made, the city engineer has filed his report and filed in the
office of the Recorder of said Milwaukie, plans and specifications, for an
improvement according to the petition heretofore filed and for an ^{improvement} improvement
together with the estimate of the work to be done and the cost thereof, and
whereas such plans and specifications and estimations are satisfactory to the
Council of the said Milwaukie thereof:

The plans, specifications, and estimations are hereby approved, and be it here
it Resolved that the purpose and intention of Milwaukie by its City Council
to make the said improvements, being described as follows to wit:

The Street shall be brought to sub-grade the full width thereof between the
curbs. On the road bed Macadam shall be not less than 16 ft. wide along the center of Street inches thick
on the center of the Street, and when completed the said Street shall be brought
6 inches at Sides to the established grade.

Said Street shall properly provided with all drains, catch basins and Cutters
necessary to preserve the grades, embankments and surface of Street, and to
provide all proper drainage. Cross walks shall made as provided in the plans
and specifications herein and approved by this resolution.

The City Recorder is here by directed to cause this resolution and notice to
be posted as required by the City Charter of Milwaukie Ore.

the foregoing resolution was adopted by the Council of Milwaukie at the 14th
meeting held on the 14th day of March 1911.

On motion it was ordered that bids upon street improvements should be accompanied by a certified check of 5% of the amount of the bid and that the contractor must furnish a bond for the faithful carrying out of his contract to the amount of one fifth of the contract price.

A special meeting of the Council was called to order by Mayor Streib, rolled called showed the following officers present: Philip Streib, Mayor, W.A.Hansen, Recorder; Davis, Marshal; Councilman Warren Knight, J.R.Kelso, Chas. T. Stockton, W.F.Lehman, ~~Chas. T. Stockton.~~

Ordinance No. ~~51~~ entitled An Ordinance to provide for the improvement of Main Street, Milwaukie, Oregon, from the North boundary line of Milwaukie, Southerly to South side of Foster road, was taken up for final passage and upon motion and roll call was duly passed.

On motion the Recorder was instructed to advertise for bids for improvements *on main street* in the Daily Abstract published in Portland Oregon.

In regard to the Front Street improvement the Mayor refered this to the Street Committee for further consideration.

Ordinance Number 50 *All Ordinances regulating Bid and roll* was taken up read and on motion and roll call the vote resulted as follows: Knight, Kelso, Lehman, Stockton, Aye; Nays none so the Ordinance passed.

~~Proposed~~ Ordinance Number 50 was ~~read for first time~~ and upon motion ordered posted.

The Portland General Electric Co. asked that a certain sum of money be paid them to install certain lights.

On motion it was ordered that the lights be not installed until said Co. was willing to install the same according to their franchise and the matter was refered to the Street Committee.

A petition signed by the property owners along Main Street asking for better fire protection was read and referred to the Committee on personal property.
