

The hour of 8:30 having arrived the Mayor opened the hearing on the question of withdrawal of annexed areas from the Milwaukie Rural Fire Protection District and called for objections to the same. It was shown that proper notice of the hearing had been given. There was no citizen present who made objection and no written objection had been received.

A petition, signed by owners of property along Sellwood Street east of 35th Street, requesting that sewers be laid in 35th Street from Sellwood Street to the east city limit line, was laid before the Council. It was moved by Aebi and seconded by Howard that the manager have the Engineer's survey made for this improvement. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Manager laid before the Council an agreement for the City's participation in the County-City Mosquito Control Program. It was moved by Mortensen and seconded by Aebi that the Council approve the program and that the Mayor be authorized to sign the agreement. Motion carried and so ordered.

There having been no objection to the withdrawal of annexed areas from the Milwaukie Rural Fire Protection District and the hour of 9:00 o'clock having arrived, the Mayor declared the hearing closed.

Ordinance Number 783 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Howard and seconded by Aebi that Ordinance No. 783 be passed to its second reading. Motion carried and so ordered.

Manager Mullan reported the total costs of the Ardenwald Area "B" sewers and stated that the Recorder was now ready to send out the notices of the proposed assessments to the property owners and requested that the Council set a date for the hearing on the assessment. It was decided and agreed that the hearing of this assessment be held on the 21st day of March, 1960.

A group of Milwaukie business owners laid before the Council a complaint in the form of a petition protesting the City's Business License. The petition, which had been signed by thirty business operators in Milwaukie, stated that Ordinance No. 489 was unfair and discriminatory. Several of the petitioners spoke on the matter and the majority appeared to be not so opposed to a business license but to feel that the requirements as set forth in the ordinance were not being enforced. There was considerable discussion on the question. The Council requested Attorney Sheldahl to make a study of the Ordinance as amended by Ordinance 535, to determine if there might be a way to correct the flaws which had been pointed out by the petitioners.

On motion duly made and carried the meeting adjourned.

MEETING OF MARCH 14, 1960

944-th MEETING

The Nine Hundred Forty-fourth regular meeting of the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, was held at the City Hall in Milwaukie, Oregon, on the 14th day of March, 1960, commencing at the hour of 7:30 o'clock P.M.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Earl M. Clay, Chairman of the Council.

The roll was called by Clerk Ellen Martin.

Those present were: Mayor Earl M. Clay; Councilmen Peter Mortensen, James M. Howard, Theron E. Sedgwick and E. H. Aebi, being all of the members of the City Council. Also present at the meeting were City Manager Leonard B. Mullan and City Attorney John O. Sheldahl.

The minutes of the nine hundred forty-third regular meeting of the Council, held on the eighth day of February, 1960 were approved as read.

The minutes of a Special meeting of the Council, held on the twenty-sixth day of February, 1960, were approved as read.

The minutes of a Special meeting of the Council, held on the twenty-ninth day of February, 1960, were approved as read.

Bids for furnishing the City with Police and Fire department radio equipment were opened and read as follows:

It was moved by Councilman Mortensen and seconded by Councilman Sedgwick that the bids be referred to the City Manager and Fire Chief Lillis for their further investigation and that upon their recommendation the equipment be purchased from the lowest responsible bidder. Motion carried and so ordered.

A petition, requesting that 37th Street along the west side of Strawberry Hill Addition, be improved, was laid before the Council. The petitioners were advised that the Plator of Strawberry Hill had given the east one-half of a street and had dedicated the same in his plat, but that the owner of property along the west side of the street had sold the land unplatted and had not allowed for a street, and as a result, the land was now owned by several owners; that the City could not accept a street under a minimum width of fifty feet, and were advised to contact the owners of the land along the street to ascertain if they were willing to give the necessary land to widen the street.

It was moved by Councilman Peter Mortensen and seconded by Councilman Sedgwick that Ordinance Number 481 be amended to prohibit the keeping of bees in the City, except by the approval of adjacent neighbors. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 782, AN ORDINANCE withdrawing from Wichita Rural Zoning District, Clackamas County, Oregon, those parts of said District heretofore annexed to and incorporated within the boundaries of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, was taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following result being had: Ayes: Clay, Howard, Mortensen, Aebi and Sedgwick. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 782 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Ordinance Number 783, AN ORDINANCE withdrawing from Milwaukie Rural Fire Protection District, Clackamas County, Oregon, those parts of said District heretofore annexed to and incorporated within the boundaries of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, was taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following result being had: Ayes: Clay, Howard, Mortensen, Aebi, and Sedgwick. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 783 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

A letter from the Milwaukie Planning Commission, in which they recommended certain zone changes, was read. It was moved by Councilman Mortensen and seconded by Councilman Howard that the Planning Commission's recommendation be approved. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 784 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Councilman Howard and seconded by Councilman Mortensen that Ordinance Number 784 be passed to its second reading and that it be read at this time. Motion carried and so ordered. Ordinance Number 784 AN ORDINANCE providing for the re-zoning of certain properties in the City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon, from Zone 3R-1 to Commercial Zone and from Zone 3R-1 to 3R-2 Zone, amending Ordinance Number 481, as amended, and declaring an emergency was taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following result being had. Ayes: Clay, Howard, Mortensen, Aebi and Sedgwick. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 784 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Ordinance Number 785 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Councilman Sedgwick and seconded by Councilman Howard that Ordinance Number 785 be moved to its second reading and that it be read at this time. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 785 AN ORDINANCE providing for the procedure, without election, to annex certain territories, contiguous to the present boundaries of the

City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon, fixing a day for public hearing before the City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, on the question of such annexation, directing publication of notice of such hearing, and declaring an emergency was again taken up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following result being had. Ayes: Clay, Howard, Mortensen, Aebi and Sedgwick. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 785 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

It was moved by Councilman Howard and seconded by Councilman Aebi that all properties within the City of Milwaukie, not withdrawn from outside Sewer, Fire or Zoning Districts, be withdrawn from such districts. Motion carried and so ordered.

Applications for recommendations for liquor licenses were read as follows: CHAR HOUSE, (Alfire Inc.) for a "D.A." (Class "A" Dispenser's License) DIERINGER'S MARKET, for a "P.B." (Package Store Class "B") license.

It was moved by Councilman Sedgwick and seconded by Councilman Howard that both recommendations be granted. Motion carried and so ordered.

Manager Mullan read a final report from Stevens and Thompson on the Cole Addition-Walnut Park sewers, which showed a balance due Don Thornton, Contractor, of \$6398.01. It was moved by Councilman Howard and seconded by Councilman Sedgwick that the Council accept the Walnut Park-Cole Addition sewers and that the hearing on the assessment for same be set for April 11, 1960, and that Don Thornton be paid \$6398.01. Motion carried and so ordered.

Manager Mullan presented a bill for services (Municipal Bonds Proceedings) from Sheldahl and Misko, Attorneys, in the amount of \$1,987.50. It was moved by Councilman Howard and seconded by Councilman Sedgwick that the bill be approved and paid. Motion carried and so ordered.

Manager Mullan presented a bill from Stevens & Thompson for engineering services in the Cole Addition-Walnut Park sewer project. It was moved by Councilman Howard and seconded by Councilman Aebi that the bill be approved and paid. Motion carried and so ordered.

The Police Chief's report was read and ordered filed.

Manager Mullan reported that Allen F. Hall had been assessed for three feet of curb along Harvey Street where no curb had been laid. It was moved by Councilman Howard and seconded by Councilman Sedgwick that the assessment for three feet of curb be excused on Tax Lot 1-1, Campbell D. L. C. Motion carried and so ordered.

Manager Mullan read a letter, from the Milwaukie Volunteer Fire Department, in which the following request and agreement was made:

"We, the members of the Milwaukie Volunteer Fire Department, respectfully request the City Council to purchase, for each member of the department, Plektron monitoring units. These units, when placed in the homes of the volunteers, would enable each of the men to know the nature and the location of a fire before the fire apparatus left the station.

In accordance with the Council's agreement to the above request, we, the members of the Milwaukie Volunteer Fire Department, agree to relinquish our monthly allotment for attendance at drills and fires, until such time as the units are paid for."

It was moved by Councilman Howard and seconded by Councilman Aebi that on the approval and recommendation of Fire Chief Lillis, the Council approve the plan, as stated in the letter, and furnish the Volunteer Fire Department members with the monitoring units. Motion carried and so ordered.

Manager Mullan read a letter from the Milwaukie Volunteer Fire Department, in which they requested that uniform-type chest badges be furnished to them. The Council discussed this request but took no definite action on the question.

Attorney Sheldahl reported that Messrs, Shuler, Sayer, Winfree & Rankin had approved the sale of General Obligation Bonds in the amount of \$85,000.00 for the purpose of constructing a new fire station within the City, and the purchase of new fire fighting equipment.

It was then moved by Councilman James Howard and seconded by Councilman E. H. Aebi that the following transcribed resolution be adopted.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 6-1960

A RESOLUTION PROVIDING FOR THE ISSUANCE AND SALE OF NEGOTIABLE GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKIE, CLACKAMAS COUNTY, OREGON, IN THE PRINCIPAL SUM OF \$85,000.00; PRESCRIBING THE FORM OF SAID BONDS AND OF THE INTEREST COUPONS PERTAINING THERETO; PROVIDING FOR THE SALE OF SAID BONDS; AND PROVIDING FOR NOTICE OF SUCH SALE.

WHEREAS, heretofore, on the 15th day of October, 1959, at a special election duly called and held in the City of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, Oregon, the legal voters of said City duly adopted Chapter VIII-B as an amendment to the Charter of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, adopted by the people of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, on the 7th day of November, 1944, as amended, which provides as follows:

"CHAPTER VIII-B

"In addition to the other methods provided by the Charter of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, or the General Laws of the State of Oregon, and not in derogation of any such powers, the City Council of the City of Milwaukie, when in its discretion it is deemed advisable, may provide by resolution or resolutions for the construction, either by contract method or City construction method, or by the combination of both, to construct and provide for the construction of a new fire station within the city limits of the said City of Milwaukie, Oregon, and to acquire by purchase new fire fighting trucks and other fire fighting equipment, together with all the appurtenances necessary for the completion and operation of said improvements, and for such purposes may acquire by gift, purchase, grant or condemnation necessary lands and easements therefor, either within or without the corporate limits of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, or any part of the foregoing; and to pay the cost thereof, the City Council of the City of Milwaukie is hereby authorized to issue not to exceed \$85,000:00 in general obligation bonds of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, which shall be paid by an ad valorem tax on all taxable property within the corporate limits of the said City of Milwaukie.

"The City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, each year shall provide in the budget for sufficient funds to pay the principal and interest on said general obligation bonds of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, which taxes shall be in addition to all other taxes permitted by the Charter, as amended, of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, and the Laws of the State of Oregon."

and

WHEREAS, It is now necessary to procure funds for the aforesaid purposes and to issue the bonds authorized by said charter amendment so designated as Chapter VIII-B; now therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, that the City of Milwaukie, in Clackamas County, State of Oregon, do issue and sell its negotiable general obligation bonds in the principal sum of \$85,000.00 for the purpose of constructing and providing for the construction of a new fire station within the city limits of the said City of Milwaukie, Oregon, for the purpose of acquiring by purchase new fire fighting trucks and other fire fighting equipment, together with all the appurtenances necessary for the completion and operation of said improvements, and for the purpose of acquiring by gift, purchase, grant or condemnation, the necessary lands and easements therefor, either within or without the corporate limits of the City of Milwaukie, and to pay the cost thereof.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED By the City Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, that said negotiable general obligation bonds shall be dated April 1, 1960, and shall be in the denomination of ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,000.00) each and shall be numbered consecutively beginning with number ONE (1) and ending with number EIGHTY-FIVE (85) and shall be issued to mature serially in numerical order in principal amounts as follows:
