MEETING OF APRIL 9, 1956

COUNCIL CHAMBER

890 MEETING

The eight hundred nintieth regular meeting of the Council of the City of Milwaukie, was held on the ninth day of April, 1956.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Mullan.

Present: Mayor Mullan; Councilmen Clay, Perkins, Shook and Klein; City Manager Burdick, Attorney Sheldahl and Recorder Martin.

The minutes of the eight hundred eighty-ninth regular meeting of the Council, held on the twenty-sixth day of March, 1956, were approved as written,

Two property owners, (from 34th Street) were present and asked questions on the matter of the re-paving of sidewalks and driveways, now being done by Cushing Bros. along 34th Street Quincy Addition. Mr. Burdick reported that many places had been found where the thickness of the walks or driveways did not come up to the specifications as to thickness but that the concrete was in conformance with the specifications. Mr. Burdick urged the two gentlemen to get in touch with other property owners and have them report to him (Burdick) if they wish their walks re-done.

Written application and consent to annex to the City of Milwaukie, of all of Blocks 17 and 12, Minthorn Addition to the City of Portland, except Lots 5,6,7,8,9,10,37,38,39,40,41,42,43 and 44, Block 17, was laid before the Council. It was reported that the owners of the above listed lots were about to sell the same to Mr. Derringer, who plans to include them in the application for annexation. The Council decided to take no action on the matter at this time, pending the transfer of this property.

The matter of Parks and Park Commission was discussed at some length. It was moved by Perkins and seconded by Shook that the City Attorney furnish each Councilman with the Oregon Code Laws pertaining to Parks and Park Commissions. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 639 was taken up and read for its first reading. It was moved by Shook and seconded by Klein that Ordinance Number 639 be passed to its second reading, and that it be read at this time. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 639 AN ORDINANCE providing for the procedure to annex certain territory contiguous to the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, dispensing with the submission of the question of such annexation to the registered voters of the City of Milwaukie, fixing a day for public hearing before the Council of the City of Milwaukie, Oregon, at which time the registered voters of the City may appear and be heard on the question of annexation, directing publication of notice of such hearing, and declaring an emergency, was taken

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up and read for its second reading and put on its passage with the following results being had: Ayes: Mullan, Clay, Perkins, Shook and Klein. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 639 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

It was moved by Perkins and seconded by Shook that the Mayor hereby be authorized to appoint a committee of five, to be composed of two dentists practicing in Milwaukie, one Medical Doctor, practicing within Milwaukie, and two Council members, to investigate the question of flouridation of the Milwaukie water system;

That the Mayor, in his capacity of City Health Officer, serve as ex-officio member of this committee;

That the committee be instructed to check to determine the recommendation of the State Board of Health Officials, the medical and dental Societies and such other competent authorities in the field that may be available to them and report back with a recommendation to the Council not later than the first meeting in May;

That the City Manager be hereby instructed to secure a quantity of the "stuffer sized" folder, a copy of which is presented herewith, and to include them in the next regular mailing of the water bill following their receipt;

That the City Manager be instructed hereby to secure cost estimates on the installation of flouridation equipment and to have these estimates with his recommendation as to the most desirable system available at the first regular Council meeting in May;

That the City Clerk be instructed to secure the folder information, a sample of which is herewith furnished, for each of the Council members to be mailed to their homes as soon as it is available. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Klein and seconded by Shook that the Council appoint the following freeholders to serve on the Budget Committee: John Botsford, to fill out the undexpired term of Earl S. Burdick, to 1957; Dr. James Howard, for full term, to 1958; Mr. Ed. Jasmer, for full term, 1958.

It was moved by Shook and seconded by Klein that the following bills be approved and that warrants be drawn for the payment of same

MEETING OF APRIL 23, 1956

COUNCIL CHAMBER

891st MEETING

The eight hundred ninety-first regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the twenty-third day of April, 1956.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Mullan.

Present: Mayor Mullan; Councilmen Clay, Perkins, Shatzk and Klein; Manager Burdick, Attorney Sheldahl and Recorder Martin.

The minutes of the eight hundred nintieth regular meeting of the Council, held on the ninth day of April, 1956, were approved as written.

A letter from the Milwaukie Planning Commission, in which they recommended that a proposed plat of the Bisio property, along Lake Road, be accepted, was read. The proposed plat showed a fifty foot wide roadway running northerly from Lake Road, with a jog to the west and dead ending with a turn-around having a radius of 37.5 feet, said turn-around would be 193.04 feet south of the south boundary of Quincy Addition. The jog to the west permitted the roadway to pass the Henry Bisio residence which has been on the property many years, it would also put the north end of the street in line with 32nd Street Quincy Addition. After viewing the plat the Council decided that it be referred back to the Planning Commission and that they (Planning Commission) be requested to bring a plat of the now vacant land between Quincy Addition and Lake Road, showing tentative locations of streets.

A deed, signed by T.H. and Vista Fenton, for a part of Lot 5 Block 18, Quincy Addition, and conveyed for street purposes, was laid before the Council. This land would extend 32nd Street southerly from Wister Street to the south line of Quincy Addition. It was moved by Perkins and seconded by Klein that the deed be accepted. Motion carried and so ordered.

Mr. Clyde Bassler came before the Council with a plot plan for property on both sides of Adams Street between 21st Street and Main Street. The plan called for using Adams Street for parking area and request was made for vacation of that portion of Adams Street. Mr. Basler stated that United Investment Co. would develop the property and that his grocery store and Cooper's Market would be tenants, and that he did not wish the Council to misunderstand his motive in presenting the plat plan. The Council decided to view the property before taking any action, and would report their decision to Mr. Basler.

Mr. Vernon Utz, owner of Lots 10 and 11, Block 13, and Mr. Earl Thompson, owner of Lots 14 and 15 Block 13, all in Quincy Addition, came before the Council; they stated that they also represented Mr. Robert Wisner, owner of Lots 19 and 20, Block 13 Quincy Addition. These gentlemen stated that when
