MEETING OF APRIL 10, 1950

COUNCIL CHAMBERS

746th MEETING

The seven hundred forty-sixth regular meeting of the Council was held on the tenth day of April, 1950.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sperr.

Present: Mayor Sperr, Councilmen Taylor, Norbeck, and Frady; Manager Taber, Attorney Kirkpatrick, and Recorder Martin.

Mayor Sperr announced that Mr. Leonard Mullan had been appointed to fill the unexpired term of P.E. Mortensen. Mr. Mullan was sworn in to office by the Recorder and took his seat at the Council table.

Mr. H.C. Morris from Western Door and Plywood Company appeared before the Council with regard to adequate water supply to operate a sprinkling system at their plant. Mr. J.W. Larsen, representing the Viking Company (Automatic Sprinklers) stated that the Oregon Insurance Rating Bureau did not consider that the present eight inch and six inch water mains, which presently are available to the Western Door and Plywood Plant, adequate for pressure required to operate the sprinkling system contemplated for the plant and that they (Western Door and Plywood) were requesting that the City make available a twelve-inch main for this purpose. It was moved by Frady and seconded by Norbeck that Manager Taber, Attorney Kirkpatrick, and Mayor Sperr meet with representatives from Western Door and Plywood Company in an effort to work out a plan whereby a twelve-inch main can be made available to their plant at 31st and Meek Streets. Motion carried and so ordered.

The matter of changing the zone in Block 3, Lewelling Park was again brought up for hearing. Manager Taber stated that earlier in the evening Mr. William B. Adams, who had made protest against the change at the hearing on March 27th, had called him (Taber) by phone and had stated that he (Adams) had no objection to the zone change. It was moved by Frady and seconded by Norbeck that that portion of Lot 3, Block 3, Lewelling Park not now in Zone 1, be changed from Zone 3R-1 to Zone 1 (Commercial). Motion carried and so ordered.

Mr. C. Byington, 3346 Lake Road, came before the Council and reported that automobiles were traveling with excessive speed along Lake Road, and asked that something be done to slow them up. It was decided that Mr. Taber would contact the State Highway Department and request that they install a blinking amber light at Oatfield and 34th Streets at Lake Road.

Mr. Glen Cottrell came before the Council and again asked what the City intends to do with Leo Fontana's dogs. Manager Taber stated that he had attended a meeting in Oregon City at which there were represented West Linn, Oregon City, and Gladstone as well as Milwaukie, and that there was real effort being made to work out a workable plan to control the running at large of dogs.

Mr. Taber suggested that our Ordinances 89 and 220 be repealed by an ordinance that could be enforced. It was recommended that Officer Delp notify Mr. Cottrell when Leo is released from jail that a warrant of arrest, on complaint in the Municipal Court, be served on him (Leo Fontana) immediately upon his release.

The Mayor read letters from Wayne Morse and Guy Cordon, U.S. Senators from Oregon, in which each stated that he favored the lifting of the "freeze" order on construction permits for television.

It was moved by Frady and seconded by Taylor that Ordinance Number 539 be read by title only for its second reading. Motion carried and so ordered.

Ordinance Number 539, AN ORDINANCE creating a City Planning Commission, determining the method of selection of its personnel, its selection of officers, and its powers and duties; and providing a penalty, was taken up and read by title only for its second reading and put on its passage with the following results being had: Ayes: Sperr, Taylor, Mullan, Norbeck, and Frady. Nays: None. Ordinance Number 539 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

It was moved by Taylor and seconded by Norbeck that Resolution Number 5, 1950 be adopted as follows:

RESOLUTION NUMBER 5, 1950

WHEREAS, traffic conditions require that limited parking be imposed on Jefferson Street from Main Street to 21st Street;

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED that pursuant to Ordinance Number 530, that the south side of Jefferson Street from Main Street easterly to 21st Street be restricted to two hour parking, and that the said Ordinance shall be effective thereto from and after the proper signs and markers have been placed thereon, and that the Street Department of the City of Milwaukie be and it hereby is instructed to place proper signs thereon to indicate that the same is limited to two hour parking.

Manager Taber was instructed to post No Parking signs on Monroe Street from R.R. easterly to 29th Street in accordance with Ordinance Number 530.

The Mayor announced that there would be a meeting of the Board of Directors for the Milwaukie Rural Fire Protection District and representatives from the Council on Tuesday evening, April 11th. It was decided that Mayor Sperr and Attorney Kirkpatrick represent the Council at this meeting.

A letter from the Milwaukie Historical Society, requesting that the City be represented at a central committee meeting, the object of said meeting to form a plan for a Centennial Celebration in Milwaukie during the coming summer, was read. It was moved by Mullan and seconded by Frady that the Mayor appoint a committee to meet with the Central Committee. The Mayor appointed Mullan and Frady.

It was moved by Taylor and seconded by Norbeck that the Mayor be authorized to sign a warrant in the amount of \$3,000.00 in payment of a rectangular strip of land paralleling McLoughlin Blvd. to be used for road purposes. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Frady and seconded by Taylor that the Mayor be authorized to execute an agreement with Cline and Eva Fixott to change the channel of Spring Creek on their property in order to divert the water through a culvert under the proposed service road paralleling McLoughlin Blvd. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Taylor and seconded by Norbeck that Manager Taber be authorized to call for bids for the proposed industrial water pipe line. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Frady and seconded by Norbeck that the following bills be approved and that the Recorder be directed to issue warrants for the payment of same:

MEETING OF APRIL 24, 1950

COUNCIL CHAMBERS

747th MEETING

The seven hundred forty-seventh regular meeting of the Council was held on the twenty-fourth day of April, 1950.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sperr.

Present: Mayor Sperr; Councilmen Taylor, Mullan, Norbeck, and Frady; Manager Taber, Attorney Kirkpatrick, and Recorder Martin.

The minutes of the seven hundred forty-sixth regular regular meeting of the Council, held on the tenth day of April, 1950, were corrected.

Mr. C.V. Byington, 3346 Lake Road, came before the Council and reported another accident at the corner of Lake Road and Outfield Road and requested that something be done to slow down traffic on Lake Road. There was considerable discussion as to whether or not the City should stop the logging trucks which travel Lake Road by putting up "STOP" signs, for the reason that said Road is more or less controlled by the State Highway Department. It was decided that large signs be posted at this intersection which read "SPEED LIMIT 25 MILES PER HOUR, STRICTLY ENFORCED" and that this speed limit law be enforced. Manager Taber was instructed to have the signs placed as soon as possible.

Attorney Kirkpatrick reported that Mayor Sperr, Manager Taber, Councilman Taylor, and himself had talked with Mr. Morris, of the Western Door and Plywood Company, and that a tentative arrangement was being made whereby Western Door and Plywood would lay the pipe line necessary for their sprinkling system and the cost of same would be liquidated through the stand-by charge to the City. The matter was tabled for further developments.

Mayor Sperr reported that Attorney Kirkpatrick, Fire Chief Lewellyn and himself had met with the members of the Rural Fire District Board of Directors and that the Rural Fire District were desirous of taking out a small portion in the northern portion of their district and allocating the same to the protection of the Errol Heights Volunteer Fire Department on account of its proximity to that Department's headquarters; also that the manner of rating the pay for the protection would have to be changed on account of the re-assessment of property in Clackamas County, and that instead of paying at the rate of millage on taxes they would rather pay a specific fee, inasmuch as the Rural Fire District is governed by the 6% limitation, they ask that their first year's fee under a new contract, be the same as last year's fee and that the increase be governed by the 6% limitation. Mr. Kirkpatrick stated that they were to have another meeting with the Board and requested that Mr. Mullan be added to the Committee. The Mayor appointed Mr. Mullan to the Committee.

Mr. Mullan reported that the meeting of Committees from various organizations to form a central committee for the purpose of holding a Centennial Celebration in Milwaukie this coming summer would hold another meeting on Wednesday, April 26th.

It was moved by Frady and seconded by Norbeck that Manager Taber be authorized to proceed with the building of a spur track for International Harvester Company by force account with Southern Pacific Company's labor. Motion carried and so ordered.
