The meeting called to order by Mayor Sperr at 8:00 P.M. for the purpose of discussing:

1. The issuing of a building permit to build a chinchilla house on a subdivision of tract D, Cogswell First Addition.

2. The vacation of Moss Street.
3. The consideration of annexing Sellwood Gardens, as proposed by The Milwaukie Chamber of Commerce.
4. Conformation of wire to International Harvester extending their option ten days.

Present: Sperr, Frady, Mortensen, Norbeck, Taylor, Taber, Kirkpatrick.
Absent: Martin.

After considerable discussion and upon motion by Frady and seconded by Mortensen, the Council unanimously passed the following; Mr. Charles Hughey be granted a building permit, and use permit for the building, for the purpose of housing chinchillas, further that the building should never be used to house any other animals which are not permitted by City Ordinance.

Jack Carr, Superintendent of Western Door and Plywood, appeared before the Council and asked that the vacation of Moss Street be not granted. After a great deal of discussion and because of the absence of both Mr. Millican and Mr. Servas, the matter was tabled until the next meeting, and the Mayor appointed a committee to meet with both interested parties, Millican and Servas and Western Door and Plywood. He appointed Sperr, Taber, and Kirkpatrick.

Mr. Shrock and Mr. Charack again appeared before the Council to talk about annexing Sellwood Gardens. Mr. Kirkpatrick reported that he and the Water Superintendent had been down to Sellwood Gardens and looked the system over and talked with some of the residents of the area and he felt that the people were not too unhappy with things as they now were. Mr. Taber reported that he and Mr. Hofmann had also made a very rough survey of the water system, and the only way that he thought that any very great improvement in the system would entail the laying of new mains and new service connections, at an estimated cost of \$12,000.00. Mr. Taylor moved that the annexation of Sellwood Gardens should not be considered until the residents of the area petition for the same. Seconded by Frady and unanimously carried. (Mr. Frady moved that the International Harvester Company be granted a ten day extension on their option to purchase 7.4 acres in the Kellogg Park Industrial Area. Seconded by Mr. Mortensen and unanimously carried. There being no further business to come before the Council, and upon motion duly made and carried, the meeting was adjourned.
