TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, APRIL 8TH. 1913.

The one hundred thirty-third (133) regular meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date.

Meeting called to order by Mayor Elmer: Present, Mayor Elmer, Councilmen Mitchell, Davis, King and Counsell, Recorder Mathews and Treasurer Bolstad. The minutes of the one hundred thirty-second (132) regular meeting held on the 11th day of March, 1913, and the minutes of the adjourned meeting of the regular meeting held on the 20th. day of March, 1913, also the minutes of the call meeting held on the 24th. day of March, 1913, were read and approved as read.

The following bills were read and upon motion of councilman King seconded by councilman Mitchell and carried were allowed as corrected by the Finance Committee and the Recorder was instructed to draw

The Bill of B. M. Fisch for improvements to his water system amounting to the sum of \$910.47 was read and upon motion duly seconded and carried, the recorder was instructed to place the same on file.

The petition of Chapin and Herlow to vacate certain streets in Milwaukie was referred to the street committee for investigation.

Upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Davis and carried, the matter of the appointment of arbitrators to appraise the value of the Milwaukie water works and the Minthorne Springs Water system was postponed until the adjourned meeting to be held at 8 O'clock P. M. Tuesday, the 15th. day of April, 1913.

The application of A. W. Wachter for a license to conduct a pool room in Milwaukie was read, and upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Davis and carried, the Recorder was instructed

to issue Mr. Wachter a license to operate a pool room in the Wetzler Bldg. in Milwaukee. The petition of the property owners on Quincy street for the improvement of said street was read, and upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Counsell and carried, the City Engineer was instructed to make plans, specifications and estimates of the probable cost of the improvement thereof. A petition for the improvement of De Witt Street was also read and upon motion duly seconded and carried, the City Engineer was instructed to make plans, specifications and estimates of the probable cost for the improvement of the same. Upon motion of Councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Davis and carried, the matter of the completion of Harrison street was referred to the Street Committee. Upon motion duly seconded and carried, the Council proceeded with the election of a councilman as provided by the amendment to the Town Charter. Nominations being declared in order, the following persons were placed in nomination; Knight Ray Albee and Warren. The nominations being closed a vote was taken with the following results: Ray Albee received three votes and Warren Knight one vote. Mr. Albee receiving a majority of the votes cast was declared to be elected councilman to serve until the general election in 1914. Upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman King and carried, W. H. Counsell was instructed to place caps over the monuments on Main street.

Upon motion duly seconded and carried, Ordinance No. 83 was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read, the Roll-call showed the following results; Ayes, Mitchell, King, Davis, Counsell and Albee; Nays, none. Ordinance No. 83 passed the first reading.

Upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Davis and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 83 was taken up for the second reading. The Ordinance being read the roll-call showed the following results; Ayes, Mitchell, King, Davis, Counsell and Albee. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 83 passed the second reading. Upon motion of Councilman Mitchell and seconded by councilman King and carried, the rules were suspended and Ordinance No. 83 was taken up for the third and final reading. The Ordinance being read, the roll-call showed the following results; Ayes, Mitchell, King, Counsell, Davis and Albee. Nays, none. Ordinance No. 83 passed.

Upon motion duly seconded and carried the meeting adjourned until Tuesday the 15th. day of April, 1913, at 8:00 P. M.
