

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, APRIL 8TH. 1924.

The two hundred sixty-fifth regular meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the eighth day of April, 1924. Meeting called to order by Mayor Cowell. Present, Mayor Cowell, Councilmen Johnson, Kerr, Miller, McIntyre and Kleeb, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck.

The minutes of the two hundred sixty-fourth regular meeting of the Council held on the 12th. day of March, 1924, were read and approved as read.

A communication from the State Fire Marshal in regard to sending delegates to the Fire School at Corvallis, Oregon, was read and ordered placed on file. A communication from the City of Portland in regard to furnishing a map of the Milwaukie Water System was read and ordered placed on file.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the public Auto Camp was ordered closed. The City Treasurer's Report was read and referred to Finance Committee for correction. A petition for the improvement of Harvey Street was read and referred back to the petitioners for correction.

The application of O. F. Witte for a dance hall license was read and upon motion duly made and carried, the application was granted and the recorder was instructed to issue a dance hall license to Mr. Witte.

Mr. Armstrong Glover was present and requested the Council to furnish him bull run water. Upon motion duly made and carried, the request of Mr. Armstrong was granted, upon the condition that he pay the same rates for water as other outside users, and that he pay all costs of connections and meter. Mr Fuller was present and requested the Council to construct a cross walk between 30th and 31st. Streets. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Street Committee was instructed to construct a cross walk between 30th and 31st. Streets. The matter of constructing a cross walk across 28th street at the south side of Lake Road was referred to the Street Committee with full authority to act. Upon motion duly made and carried, ordinance No. 208 was taken up for the first reading. The Light Committee recommended that arc lamps be installed at the following places: One at 40th and Harrison Streets; One on 31st Street approximately 200 feet north of Sellwood Street; One on 27th Street on a pole in front of entrance to Grammer School, and a fourth one to be installed wherever designated by the Mayor. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Water Supt. was instructed to install a one inch water main along Sellwood Street.
