

MEETING OF APRIL 8, 1946

COUNCIL CHAMBERS

650th MEETING

The six hundred fiftieth regular meeting of the Council was held on the eighth day of April 1946.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sperr.

Present: Mayor Sperr, Councilmen Nelson, Roberts, Hamlin, City Manager Kelsey, Attorney Kirkpatrick, Auditor Phillips, Officer Burbank, Water Supt. Hofmann, and Treasurer Walcott, sAbsent:sCouncilman Rowe, and Recorder Martin. Vivian Walcott, served as Acting Recorder, by appointment of City Manager Kelsey.

Minutes of six hundred forty-ninth regular meeting held on March twenty-fifth, 1946, were read, and approved as read.

Mr. Kelly, of Kelly Boat Co., appeared before the Council concerning his permit for a Building which is to house a 20 gauge saw and other machinery, and used as a re-saw mill in connection with the Boat manufacturing business. Motion was made by Roberts, and seconded by Nelson that Mr. Kelly be permitted to build a 50'x100' machinery building of sheet iron on his property in Gallup Addition Milwaukie. Motion carried and so ordered.

*Buses.* Mr. Murphy of East Side Buses, appeared before the Council regarding the change of location for the Bus loading zone, from the present location on Monroe Street, to the location designated on Jackson Street, by the Council. Mr. Murphy did not favor the construction or erection of a shelter on Jackson Street until the location had been given a 30 day trial, as to what the re-action of bus patrons would be. He stated the Bus Co., was willing to put money in escrow, to cover the cost of a shelter, until such time as they and the City deemed the location had proven satisfactory. It was agreed that the City of Milwaukie, to mark off bus loading zone, on the south side of Jackson Street, from Main to Standard Station, leaving the alley and private driveway free from loading zone. Mr. Kelsey to notify the bus company when ready for them to move, which was not to be later than April 15, 1946.

Ordinance Number 475, establishing certain through streets or portions of streets in Milwaukie and requiring the erection of STOP signs, so as to indicate the same, and requiring vehicles entering such through streets to come to a complete STOP at such points and repealing Ordinance Number 390, was taken up for the second time. It was moved by Roberts and seconded by Nelson that Ordinance Number 475 be read by title only. Motion carried and so ordered. The vote was called with the following result being had. Ayes: Hamlin, Roberts, Nelson and Sperr. Naves: None. Ordinance number 475 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Ordinance Number 476, an Ordinance to prohibit reverse or U turns at certain intersections, was taken up for the second time, and read in full, and was put on its' passage with following result being had. Ayes: Roberts, Nelson, Sperr and Hamlin. Naves. None. Ordinance number 476 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

Ordinance Number 477, providing for Regulation of parking, was read for the first time, and was referred to the City Attorney for further amendments.

Manager Kelsey brought up the application of Lester Reifschneider and Carl W. Nelson for a permit for a temporary building 8'x8' to be used for an office on used car Sales Lot, located at 1135 Super Highway. Motion was made by Nelson and seconded by Roberts that temporary permit be granted for temporary building to Carl W. Nelson and Lester Reifschneider at their location at 1135 Super Highway. Motion carried and was so ordered.

MEETING OF APRIL 30, 1946 (cont'd)

Members of the Council announced their selection of Members for Budget Committee as follows. Mayor Spear: Silas Peake and M.J. Walsh; Roberts: J.C. Hinshaw; Nelson: Harry Ray; Hamlin: R.C. Williams; Rowe: Chas. Kemmerer. In order to complete the Committee, Mr. Rowe being absent, Mayor Spear named Chas. Kemmerer, former Budget Committeeman, to serve with Mr. Rowe. The period of time for each to serve, was to be announced at a later meeting.

It was stated by Manager Kelsey, that his appeal to Dwyer Logging Co.; operating through Milwaukie, under bond, for re-imbursment account damage to certain City Streets, has been without response, and that he would recommend to the Council that action be taken. Motion was made by Roberts and seconded by Nelson that Attorney Kirkpatrick, prepare suit against Dwyer Logging Co., for their portion of damage done to City Streets. Motion carried and was so ordered.

Attorney Kirkpatrick presented to the Council two Resolutions. First, covering Street Improvement of Thirty-seventh Street, Harvey Street to King Street. Motion was made by Roberts, and seconded by Hamlin to accept the Resolution. Motion carried and was so ordered. Second Resolution, covering Sewer Extension on Thirtieth Street, from Washington Street, to south end of Thirtieth St. Motion was made by Hamlin and seconded by Roberts to accept Resolution. Motion carried and so ordered.

Motion was made by Hamlin, and seconded by Roberts, for Atty. Kirkpatrick to prepare amendment to Uniform Building code, which would more equalize building permit fee, and to incorporate other improvements in the 1946 Uniform Building Code. Motion carried and so ordered.

Motion was made by Roberts and seconded by Nelson that the City Treasurer be authorized to refund Forty Dollars and fifty cents, (\$40.50) Meter Installation and Deposit charge, to C.A. Reed of Marine Air Service. He having arranged with I.A. Jones to consume water through his service. Motion carried and was so ordered.

Fire Chief's monthly report was read and ordered filed.

Motion was made by Nelson and seconded by Roberts that Treasurer's Financial report be accepted as presented. Motion was carried and so ordered.

Letters from Milwaukie Chamber of Commerce were read, and in which they presented certain resolutions passed at their meeting of March 27th. It was left for the Mayor's later selection of a committee in which to consider these matters with the Chamber of Commerce.

Moved by Roberts and seconded by Nelson that the following bills be allowed, and Recorder be instructed to issue warrants for the payment of same.
