MEETING OF APRIL 9, 1945

COUNCIL CHAMBERS

626th MEETING

The six hundred twenty-sixth regular meeting of the Council was held on the ninth day of April, 1945.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sperr.

Present: Mayor Sperr, Councilmen Hamlin, Nelson, Roberts, and Rowe; Water Superintendent Counsell, Attorney Kirkpatrick, Captain Stevens and Recorder Martin. Absent: Treasurer Walcott, Officer Butler and Fire Chief Lewellyn.

The minutes of the six hundred twenty-fifth regular meeting of the Council held on the twenty-sixth day of March, 1945, were read and approved as read.

Mr. C. S. Todhunter came before the Council and requested a permit to build a temporary shed (20' x 30') on Lot 7 Block 1 Lewelling Park. It was moved by Hamlin and seconded by Roberts that Mr. Todhunter be granted a permit to build a temporary shed on Lot 7 Block 1 Lewelling Park providing that the shed be allowed to remain standing not longer than six months. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Nelson and seconded by Roberts that the matter of widening the curve in Oak Street at Railroad Avenue be taken care of by the Street Commissioner. Motion carried and so ordered.

Mr. Ray Thompson came before the Council and presented plans for a juvenile recreation program. The Mayor appointed Nelson, Roberts, and Rowe as a committee to work with Mr. Thompson on this program.

The Statement of Policy presented by the Library Board was turned over to attorney Kirkpatrick for his study and advice to the Council.

Mr. Ken Martin, presented plans, through Irvin Stevens, for a concrete garage to be built at 1029 McLoughlin Blvd. and a board protection wall for an automobile steam cleaning establishment on Lot 8 Block 15 Milwaukie, and requested permits to build same. It was moved by Nelson and seconded by Roberts that Mr. Martin's application for a permit for a wood protection wall around an automobile steam cleaning wash-rack on Lot 8 Block 15 Milwaukie be denied. Motion carried and so ordered. It was moved by Hamlin and seconded by Roberts that Mr. Sperr act as a committee of one to confer with Mr. Martin regarding the roof and the driveway of the concrete garage and authorize the issuance of the permit if he sees fit to do so. Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Hamlin and seconded by Roberts that the Recorder write a letter to J. D. Saunders 2925 Washington Street advising him that his fence is in the street and asking him to move it back to the property line. Motion carried and so ordered.

Councilman Roberts reported that he expected to meet the Army Engineers on Wednesday April 11, regarding the water storage tank.

Water Superintendant Counsell reported that Mr. Broad of the Worthington Pump Co. had checked the water pumps and found them in good condition.

Mr. Sperr reported that he was waiting for Engineer-Milln to give him specifications for the Monroe Street sidewalk on the fall west of 28th street, and as soon as he receives them he will call for bids for laying of the walks.

Mr. Hamlin reported that the Kiwanis Club would use the south wall of the inside hall of the City Hall for the Honor Roll.

Mr. Hamlin reported that he had called a meeting of the committee on sewage disposal and that Mr. Spees had met with them. He stated that Carl Green had suggested a possible site for the plant and that the plant may cost \$50,000.00.

Busses It was moved by Nelson and seconded by Roberts that the Recorder write to the owners of the East Side Busses and ask them to be present at the next meeting of the Council to show cause why they should not operate in Milwaukie under a franchise. Motion carried and so ordered.

627th MEETING
