

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, APRIL 11TH. 1932.

The three hundred sixty-first regular meeting of the Council of Milwaukie was held on the 11th. day of April, 1932. Meeting called to order by Mayor Miller. Present, Mayor Miller, Councilmen Shindler, Sanders, Dean, Dell and Bevington, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Keck. The minutes of the three hundred sixtieth regular meeting of the Council held on the 14th. day of March, 1932, were read and approved as read. A communication from Presidents Council of Portland's Business and Civic Clubs in regard to meeting to be held to discuss the consolidation of Multnomah, Clackamas and Washington Counties was read, and Mayor Miller appointed Councilman Bevington to represent Milwaukie at such meeting. The application of O. F. Witte for a dance hall license was read and upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to issue Mr. Witte a Dance Hall license for a period of one year. A petition signed by owners of real property abutting on 31st. Street, between Elmer Street and Madison Street, requesting the Council to improve the east side of said street between Elmer Street and Madison Street, by constructing concrete sidewalks and concrete curb from Elmer Street to Madison Street, was read and the Council deeming it necessary to improve said street as petitioned for, upon motion duly made and carried, the City Engineer was ordered to prepare plans and specifications for said improvement, and estimates of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof.

Ordinance No. 314 granting the Portland General Electric Company a franchise was taken up for the first reading. The ordinance being read, upon the objections of Councilmen Dean and Bevington to the passage of the Ordinance it was laid on the table.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the bill of G. C. Pelton for \$47.00 for constructing the sidewalk in front of the Carr property on Monroe Street was allowed. Upon motion duly made and carried, it was ordered that Mr. LaVere receive a salary of \$30.00 per month out of the Emergency fund from the 1st day of March, 1932 to the 1st day of July, 1932, for his services in looking after the free employment bureau. The report of the Treasurer was read and ordered placed on file. The following bills were read and allowed the Finance Committee, and upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed to draw warrants in payment of the same:
