

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, APRIL 14TH. 1914.

The one-hundred-forty-fifth (145) regular meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Milwaukie, was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Elmer. Present, Mayor Elmer, councilmen, Mitchell, Loeding, King, Counsell and Albee, Recorder Mathews and Marshal Reed. The minutes of the 144th regular meeting held on the 10th day of March, 1914, and the minutes of the call meeting held on the 23rd day of March, 1914, were read and approved as read.

The following bills were allowed by the Finance Committee, and upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman King and carried, the recorder was instructed to draw warrants on the several funds in payment of the same:

Upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Loeding and carried, the Milwaukie Public School was tendered the use of the City Hall Friday Evening the 17th day of April, 1914, free of charge.

The petition of Mrs. C. L. Dunning asking the Council to allow her to bond her property for the delinquent assessment for the improvement of Foster Road was read and referred to the City Attorney for his opinion as to the legality of such proceedings.

A petition asking for the extension of Harrison Street was read and referred to the Street Committee. There being no objections to the acceptance of the completion of the improvement of Dewitt Street, and it appearing to the Council that the improvement of said street has been completed in accordance with the specifications and contract, upon motion of councilman Loeding seconded by councilman Mitchell and carried, the completion of the improvement of Dewitt Street was accepted. Upon motion of councilman Loeding seconded by councilman Mitchell and carried, the 1st day of May, 1914, at the hour of 8:00 O'clock P. M. was the time set for the hearing of objections, if any there be, to the amount apportioned to the property owners for the improvement of Dewitt Street.

Ordinance No. 101, entitled, "An Ordinance prohibiting the molesting, disturbing, injuring or tampering with any fire hydrant or fire apparatus belonging to the Milwaukie Fire Department, and prohibiting the placing or disposing of any obstruction within ten feet of any fire hydrant within the Town of Milwaukie, and providing a penalty for the violation of all or any of the provisions of this ordinance, was read and ordered posted, as required by the Charter.

Ordinance No. 102, entitled, "An ordinance regulating the exits of public buildings within the Town of Milwaukie and empowering and authorizing the Fire Commission of said Town to declare and public building unsafe until the same is properly equipped for the protection against fire; providing a penalty for the violation of the provisions of this ordinance, and declaring an emergency, was read and referred to the Fire Committee for revision.

Ordinance No. 103, entitled, "An ordinance prohibiting the turning in of false fire alarms, or otherwise interfering with the fire signals or bells, and regulating the setting out of fires within the corporate limits of the Town of Milwaukie; and providing a penalty for the violation of the provisions of this ordinance, was read and ordered posted.

Ordinance No. 104 entitled, "An ordinance providing for the cleaning up of lots and yards within the Town of Milwaukie, which constitute a fire menace; providing for passage ways in all theaters operating in said town, and providing a penalty for the violation of the provisions of this ordinance, was read and ordered posted.

Ordinance No. 106, entitled, "An ordinance amending section 4 of ordinance No. 98, entitled, "An ordinance to license, tax, regulate and restrain bar-rooms, roadhouses, drinking shops or other places where spirituous, vinous or malt liquors are sold, or kept for sale, or in any manner disposed of, and to regulate the disposal of the same; to define the duties and responsibilities of saloon-keepers, bartenders and all dealers in spirituous, malt or vinous liquors, and for the repeal of Ordinance No. 69, and providing a punishment for the violation of the provisions of this ordinance", was read and ordered posted.

Ordinance No. 107, entitled, "An ordinance declaring the assessment for the improvement of Dewitt Street in the Town of Milwaukie, Clackamas County, State of Oregon, and Declaring an emergency," was read and ordered posted.

Ordinance No. 105, entitled, " An ordinance establishing the grades on Laurel Avenue from the west line of Cleveland Street to the center line of Railroad Street," was read and ordered posted. Ordinance No. 93 was read and referred to the Street Committee. The Street Committee recommended that the ordinance be changed so as to provided for a maximum charge of \$1.00 for gas and portland conditions. Moved and seconded that the recommendation of the street Committee be accepted. Motion lost.

Resolution
No 2 - 1914

Upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman King and carried, ordinance No. 93 was ordered posted. The plans and specifications for the improvement of Laurel Avenue, and the estimates of the probable cost thereof, filed by the City Engineer, was examined by the Council and the same being satisfactory, upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Albee and carried the following Resolution and Notice was adopted:

RESOLUTION AND NOTICE FOR THE IMPROVEMENT OF LAUREL AVENUE IN THE TOWN OF MILWAUKIE, OREGON.

WHEREAS, pursuant to an order of the Town Council of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, heretofore made, the City Engineer has filed his report, and filed in the office of the Recorder of said Town of Milwaukie plans and specifications for an appropriate improvement of Laurel Avenue according to the petition heretofore filed, together with an estimate of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof, And Whereas, said plans and specifications and estimates are satisfactory to the Council of the Town of Milwaukie: THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the said plans, specifications and estimates be and the same are hereby adopted and approved, And BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that it is the purpose and intention of the Town of Milwaukie, by its Council, to make said improvements, being described as follows, to-wit:

That said Street shall be improved by grading the same to the established grade; by constructing concrete sidewalks five (5) feet in width, distance from the property line as required by City Ordinance, curbs to be of cement and parkings on both sides to be eight (8) feet in width; by constructing cross-walks; center of street to be provided with twelve (12) gravel road-way; by providing drainage pipes, inlets, gutters etc, and other incidentals to a proper improvement, as provided by the plans and specifications heretofore filed with the Recorder of Milwaukie and approved by this resolution.

The Recorder is hereby directed to cause this resolution and notice to be posted as required by the Charter of the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon.

Upon motion duly made and carried the Council adjourned until Thursday the 16th day of April, 1914.

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, APRIL 16TH 1914.

An adjourned meeting the regular one-hundred-forty-fifth (145) regular meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date. Present, Mayor Elmer, councilmen, Mitchell, King, Loeding, Counsell and Albee, Recorder Mathews and Marshal reed. The bill of the P. R. L. & P. Co. for lighting for the month of March, 1914, was read and ordered paid as corrected by the Finance Committee.

Upon motion of Councilman Loeding seconded by councilman King and carried, the Recorder was instructed to notify the Pacific Road Oiling Company and the Oregon Road Oiling Company that Council would receive bids for the oiling of the streets for the season of 1914, on or before the 1st day of May, 1914, at which time the bids would be opened. The Recorder was also instructed to post notices calling for bids for oiling said streets. Upon motion duly made and carried, the contractor was instructed to proceed with the laying of the sidewalks on Harrison Street and completion of the improvement.

Upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Loeding and carried, the Recorder was instructed to Notify Mr. Wissinger that if the old mill building on Harrison Street was not moved by the 28th day of April, 1914, the buliding would become the property of the City, Upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Loeding and carried, the Recorder was instructed to notify the Treasurer to transfer \$1500.00 from the General fund to the Front Street fund. Upon motion of councilman Albee seconded by councilman Mitchell and carried, the Mayor was instructed to appoint a committee of two to act with the mayor in getting a price on a site for the City Hall, the committee to report at the next regular meeting. The Mayor appointed the following persons as said Committee: Mr. King and Mr. Loeding.

The council adjourned subject to the call of the mayor.
