

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, APRIL 15th. 1913.

The adjourned meeting of the regular (133) meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date.

Meeting called to order by Mayor Elmer. Present, Mayor Elmer, Councilmen, Mitchell, King, Davis, Counsell and Albee, and Recorder Mathews. Upon motion of Councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Davis and carried, the following resolution was adopted:

RESOLUTION. 5-1913

WHEREAS, numerous complaints have been made to the Council concerning the manner in which the Milwaukie Tavern is being conducted and, WHEREAS, the council have received information that the proprietor of the said Tavern has violated the law and ordinances of the Town of Milwaukie in conducting said Tavern, disturbing the peace and quiet of said Town, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF MILWAUKIE, that the Milwaukie Tavern is a nuisance and is hereby declared to be such, and that the liquor license of Earl Alphin, the proprietor thereof, be and the same is hereby revoked, and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Recorder be and hereby is instructed to cancel said liquor license and return to said Earl Alphin the money paid by him to the Town for said license less the amount due the Town for the time the said license was in force. The following report of the Street committee was read and upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by Councilman Davis and carried, the report was adopted as read:

To the Honorable Mayor and Common Council of the Town of Milwaukie:
Your Street committee to whom was referred the petition of Chapin-Herlow Mortgage and Trust Co. would recommend that the Recorder be instructed to draw an ordinance vacating the west ten feet of First Street and five feet on each side of Second, Myrtle and Penance Streets, in Sellwood Addition to the Town of Milwaukie, making said streets 60 feet instead of 70 feet wide. Your Committee is of the opinion that the entire vacation of any street in the Town of Milwaukie is against public policy.

Upon motion duly seconded and carried, the City Engineer was instructed to see that the Southern Pacific Company Company placed the over-head crossing over Foster Road according to the specifications.

Upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Davis and carried, F. C. Harlow and W. H. Counsell were appointed arbitrators to act jointly with the arbitrators appointed by the several Water Companies to appraise the value of the property of the Milwaukie Water Company and the Minthorne Springs Water Company.

Upon motion of councilman King seconded by councilman Dounsell and carried, F. R. Mitchell was elected presiding Councilman.

Upon motion duly seconded and carried councilman Albee was authorized to buy such stationery as is necessary for the present needs of the Fire Department. The City Engineer explained to the Council that the present survey of Front Street is incorrect and that if the Street is improved as surveyed the cost of the improvement would be prohibitory. Mr. Morris recommended that the council change the Street in order to reduce the cost of improving the same. Mayor Elmer referred the matter to the Street Committee.

No further business coming before the meeting moved that the Council adjourn subject to the call of the Mayor. Carried.

A call meeting of the one hundred thirty-third (133) regular meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the above named date. Meeting called to order by Mayor Elmer. Present, Mayor Elmer, Councilmen Mitchell, King, Counsell, Davis and Albee and Recorder Mathews. The following report of the Street Committee was read and upon motion of councilman Mitchell seconded by councilman Albee and carried, the report was adopted as read:

To the Honorable Mayor and Council of Milwaukie:

Gentlemen: Your committee that was appointed to confer with the Bonnett Heirs do respectfully report as follows: We met the representatives of the Bonnett estate on April 16th, and they had the following offer to make in regard to the property required for street improvement, fronting their property on Harrison Street. They want the sum of \$2600.00, viz, \$2100.00 for the land that would be required and \$500.00 damage to their Water Storage system.

We also called on Mr. Streib and he stated that he had nothing to offer and would take his chances on some other mode of settlement.

We recommend that the proposition be not accepted as we think the amount asked is excessive.
