

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, APRIL 21ST. 1924.

An adjourned meeting of the two hundred sixty-fifth regular meeting of the Council was held on the 21st day of April, 1924.

Meeting called to order by Mayor Cowell. Present, Mayor Cowell, Councilmen Kerr, Miller, Kleeb and McIntyre, and Recorder Mathews.

A petition for the improvement of Harvey Street from the east line of 32nd. Street, easterly to the City limits, was read and the Council deeming it expedient and necessary that said street be improved as petitioned for, upon motion duly made and carried, the City Engineer was instructed to prepare plans and specifications for said improvement and estimates of the work to be done and the probable cost thereof. Mr. Sample was present and requested permission to install a sewer pipe across Harrison Street under the pavement.

Upon motion duly made and carried, Mr. Sample was given permission to install a sewer pipe across Harrison Street under the pavement, and the Street Supt. was instructed to install a catch-basin where the sewer pipe crosses the street on the north side and also install a tee.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Water Supt. was instructed to lay a two inch main on 32nd. Street as far as necessary.

Upon motion duly made and carried, Ordinance No. 210 entitled, "An ordinance providing for a special City Election in the Town of Milwaukie, in the County of Clackamas and State of Oregon, to vote on the question of amending the Charter of the Town of Milwaukie for the adoption or rejection of an act entitled, " A Bill for an Act to amend the Charter of the Town of Milwaukie, in the County of Clackamas and State of Oregon, by adding thereto the following sections, which shall be designated and may be cited as the "WATER POND SINKING FUND AMENDMENT", to authorize and empower said Town of Milwaukie to levy a special tax of six (6) mills on the dollar on all the taxable property within the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, each year for a period of ten (10) years from the taking effect of this act, for the purpose of creating a sinking fund to enable the Town of Milwaukie to pay the outstanding water bonds when they become due, and to enable the said Town of Milwaukie to reduce the present water rates, and to repeal all provisions of the Charter and Ordinances of the Town of Milwaukie in conflict herewith"; also for the adoption or rejection of an Act entitled, " A Bill for an act to amend the Charter of the Town of Milwaukie, in the County of Clackamas and State of Oregon, by adding thereto the following sections, which shall be designated and may be cited as the "SEWER CONSTRUCTION AMENDMENT", to authorize and empower the Town of Milwaukie, Oregon, to construct and lay sewers and drains, with all necessary man-holes, lamp-holes, catch-basins and branches, and to repair and re-lay the same, and to levy and collect an assessment upon all lots and parcels of land specially benefited by such sewers and drains to defray the whole or any portion of the cost and expense thereof, and to determine what lands are specially benefited by such sewer or drain and the amounts to which each lot or parcel of land is benefited; to provide the manner of the payment of the assessment levied to pay the cost and expense of said sewer or drain and authorizing the issuance of improvement bonds, and to repeal all provisions of the Charter and Ordinances of the Town of Milwaukie in conflict herewith", was taken up for the first reading. The Ordinance being read the roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Kerr, Miller, McIntyre and Kleeb. Nays, None. Ordinance No. 210 passed the first reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and Ordinance No. 210 was taken up for the second reading and read by title only. The Roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Kerr, Miller, McIntyre and Kleeb. Nays, None. Ordinance No. 210 passed the second reading. Upon motion duly made and carried, the rules were suspended and ordinance No. 210 was taken up for the third and final reading and read by title only. The roll-call showed the following result: Ayes, Kerr, Miller, McIntyre and Kleeb. Nays, None. Ordinance No. 210 passed.

Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned.

TOWN HALL, MILWAUKIE, OREGON, MAY 2ND. 1924.

A special meeting of the Council of the Town of Milwaukie was held on the 2nd. day of May, 1924. Meeting called to order by Mayor Cowell. Present, Mayor Cowell, Councilmen, Miller, Kleeb, Kerr and McIntyre and Recorder Mathews. The Mayor stated that the meeting was called for the purpose of appointing judges and clerks for the special election. Upon motion duly made and carried, the following persons were appointed judges and clerks to act at the special City election to be held on the 16th day of May, 1924: For Ward No. 1: Judges: F. D. Farrington, Mrs. Anna Adams and H. W. Hoesly. Clerks: Mrs. Stanley Zelasko and Arthur Webster. For Ward No. 2: Judges: William Fridwell, M. J. Walsh and N. R. Harvey: Clerks: Mrs. Alice Rigdon and Mrs. Lucylle Gervais. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Recorder was instructed, that if any of the Judges and Clerks appointed, decline to act, to select someone else to fill the vacancy. Mr. Campbell was present and demanded the Council to supply him with Full Run Water. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Water Supt. was instructed to lay a one inch water main from 35th and Water Streets northerly to Mr. Campbell's place to supply him with full run water. Upon motion duly made and carried, the Council adjourned.
