MEETING OF APRIL 22, 1946

COUNCIL CHAMBER

651st MEETING

The six hundred fifty-first regular meeting of the Council was held on the twenty-second day of April, 1946.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Sperr.

Present Mayor Sperr; Councilmen Hamlin and Nelson; Manager Kelsey, Attorney Kirkpatrick, Water Superintendent Hofmann, Officer Burbank and Recorder Martin. Absent Councilmen Roberts and Rowe Treasurer Walcott, Auditor Phillips, Fire Chief Lewellyn.

Mr. Joseph Reddick and Mr. D.C. Wax came before the Council with regard to water supply for their area. It was shown that some years ago Mr. Reddick had put in, at his expense, a one inch private line to his property which was outside of the area at Island Station which is in the regular Milwaukie Water District. Mr. Reddick stated that later other users attached on to this one inch line and he then dedded the line to the City. The problem now is that this small main is not adaqueate for the users already attached and they request that the City put in a larger main. Mr. Kelsey pointed out to the Council that if and when the City should put in a larger main, replacing this one inch main there should be about 600 feet more main laid in order to complete a loop in the main, and asked that a committee be appointed to make a complete investigation of this and other similar problems and make recommendation to the Council. The Mayor appointed the following committee: Fred Roberts, Harold Nelson, W.W. Kirkpatrick and L.D. Kelsey.

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Mr. Wm. F. Shea, of Kronberg Bros, came before the Council and requested permission to park an old piece of Fire equipment on the street in front of their place of business at 1015 Main St. It was agreed that in as much as this location was within the two hour Parking area, it would be better to park this equipment in an unrestricted area.

Mr. M.P. Edwards came before the Council and requested that he be permitted to make an apartment on the third floor of a frame residence building at 25rd and Harrison Sts. It was pointed out to Mr. Edwards that our building code prohibits an apartment in the third story of a frame building.

Ordinance Number 477, AN ORDINANCE providing the manner in which vehicles may be parked, and declaring it unlawful to park vehicles in any other manner: and providing a penalty for the violation hereof, was taken up and read for the second time as amended and put on its passage with the following results being had: Ayes: Sperr, Hamlin and Nelson. Nays None. Ordinance Number 477 passed the Council and was so declared by the Mayor.

It was moved by Hamlin and seconded by Nelson that the City of Milwaukee reject the Public Emplves Retirement System and that the State Department be so Notified. Motion carried and so ordered.

Mr. Nelson reported that Mr. Harry Ray would be unable to serve on the budget committee and that he would appoint Mr. Anton Lindstrom to fill the vacancy. *Budget*

Mr. Sperr reported that Mr. M.J. Walsh would be unable to serve on the Budget committee and that he would appoint Mr. J.M. Elder to fill the vacancy. *Budget*

The matter of the rate of speed at which the logging trucks now operating through Milwaukee were traveling on Lake Road was discussed. It was moved by Hamlin and seconded by Nelson that Mr. Kelsey report this matter to the County Commissioner and the State Public Utilities Commission. Motion carried and so ordered.

A letter from Mr. Kelsey in which he recommended that Ordinance Number 424 be amended to raise the minimum outside water user rate from \$1.40 to \$2.00 and the outside meter installation cost to be changed from a flat rate per service to a bases of cost plus 15% was read. It was decided that the committee appointed earlier in the meeting would make investigation and recommendation to the Council.

A letter from Mr. Kelsey, in which he stated the estimated cost of the proposed 30th Street sewer to be \$6,103.00, was read. It was moved by Nelson and seconded by Hamlin that the Attorney prepare the necessary resolution and ordinance covering the 30th Street sewer, Motion carried and so ordered.

A letter from Mr. Kelsey, in which he stated the estimated cost of the proposed improvement of 37th Street to be \$2,450.00 was read. It was moved by Nelson and seconded by Hamlin that the Attorney be instructed to prepare the necessary resolution and ordinance covering the improvement. Motion carried and so ordered.

A resolution ordering the construction of a sewer on Monroe Street from the present sewer on 29th Street to the easterly line of Penzance Street was read. It was moved by Nelson and seconded by Hamlin that the resolution be adopted and that the Engineer be instructed to prepare plans and specifications and estimated cost. Motion carried and so ordered.

A letter from Auditor Phillips in which he suggested that the depreciation reserved in the amounts of \$500.00 for Fire equipment and \$400.00 for the Police car, be invested in Defense Bonds and credited to Equipment fund.

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It was moved by Hamlin and seconded by Nelson that Mr. Phillip's suggestion be followed. Motion carried and so ordered.

A letter, with reference to the rates charged for Fire Dept. Telephone service from Kellogg Park, from Geo. H. Flagg, Public Utilities Commissioner of Oregon, in which he stated that the Commission must support the position of the Pacific Telephone & Telegraph Co. in that all charges for communication must be made in accordance with the tariffs on file in his office, was read. No action was taken on this matter.

It was moved by Hamlin and seconded by Nelson that the following bills be allowed and that the Recorder be directed to issue warrants for the payment of same.

State Industrial Accident Commission.....	\$76.65

Motion carried and so ordered.

It was moved by Nelson and seconded by Hamlin that the Mayor appoint a committee to make investigation and recommendation to the Council as to whether or not Milwaukie should require a license from business houses. Motion carried and so ordered. The Mayor appointed the following committee: Howard Hamlin, Harold Nelson, Fred Sperr, L.D. Kelsey, Edwin Norbeck, Ivar Tolstead, Leonard Mullan, Howard Sanders and Wm. Roberts.

Mr. Ivar Tolstead appeared before the Council and requested that they intercede on his behalf before the State Liquor Control Commission. It was decided that in as much as Mr. Tolstead had conducted his business in a proper manner and the Council had recommended license that the request be granted.

On motion duly made and seconded, the meeting adjourned.
